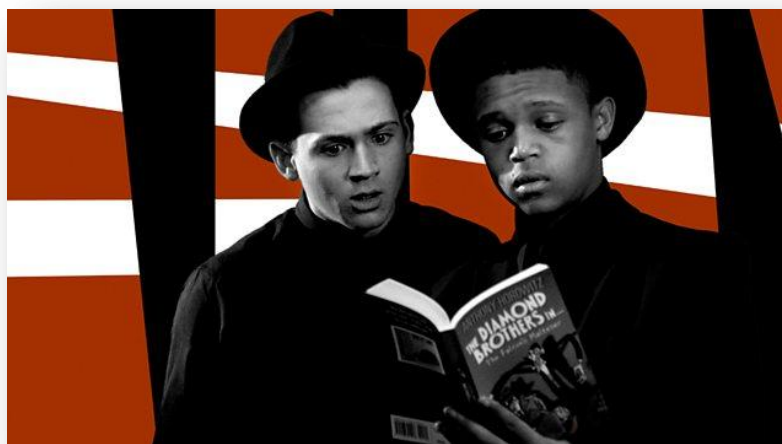

Presented by hip-hop star Akala, Poetry: Between the Lines – The Romantics explores the poetry of the Romantic period through the work of Wordsworth, Byron, Blake, Shelley and Keats. Through a mix of animation, conversation and vignette, the film expresses classic Romantic themes, ranging from the power of nature to the effects of industrialisation. Akala discusses language, form and social context with a range of experts. Through the fascination with love, loss, nature and politics, the program shows how the concerns of the Romantics are still very much alive in the present-day world.

Presenter Eleanor Nairne, an art historian and curator, plays a statue in a magical gallery who comes to life after closing time and pulls viewers head first into paintings like Andy Warhol's Marilyn Diptych and Henri Rousseau's Surprised!



While inside the paintings, Eleanor explores not only the artist, the technique and the painting, but also the social and historical context of the work, allowing each short film to be used as a jumping-off point for larger discussions and activities - themes such as multiculturalism, life during the war, industrial Britain, imagination, synaesthesia, science, the universe and mental health. Ever wanted to set sail in an umbrella boat? Or visit Van Gogh's kitchen? Fancy playing detective in the 15th century or wrestling a tiger in a dream-like jungle? This is your chance!
