I refer to our meeting held today where we discussed the following.
As you are aware, we recently arranged for you to attend an Independent Medical
Assessment (IMA) with forensic psychiatrist, Dr.
the Bank with a detailed medical report regarding your capacity to perform your
role as a Customer Service Representative. In summary, he has advised that you should be ill-health retired from the Bank and the general workforce.

Having considered the medical evidence presented in support of ill health retirement, the Chief Medical Adviser (CMA), Human Resources Dralso recommends that ill-health retirement proceed.
As outlined today, your medical retirement from the Bank will be effective today, 27 March 2013. To assist you through this difficult time the Bank will pay you 4 weeks in lieu of notice. In addition to this and in good faith, we have decided to pay you a further 12 weeks' salary to support you during this process.
We have obtained Dr permission to release a copy of the IMA he conducted with you on 14 March 2013, to your treating General Practitioner, Dr of
This was sent to Dr on 22 March 2013. The Bank strongly recommends you immediately meet with Dr who can then take you through this report if he so wishes.
