# Panther Party's Hqts. Damaged

Flames slightly damaged the storefront headquarters of the Black Panther Party at 22 Nelson Avenue early this morning. Members of the party said a "fire

bomb" was thrown through a window. Police and fire officials reported no such evidence was found.

Two Peekskill companies, Centennial Hose and the Truck Co., were called out by police when two male youths, names unknown, authorities said this morning, came into headquarters and reported a fire at the premises at 2:41 A.M.

### Report Windows Cracked
