Art in the real world

When I graduated with a Bachelor of Fine Arts from Elam in 1982, the chance of making a living from your work, or getting a job in an arts related field, was extremely slim – if not impossible.

I remember going to the Department of Labour (the equivalent of WINZ), hoping to find a job on their job-seeker boards with a sinking heart. The short interview I had to undergo was desultory. Asked about my tertiary qualifications, I would tell my interviewer I had a BFA, to which the inevitable reply was "What's that?".

My explanation prompted a longsuffering look, some eye rolling and the comment that it was *very* unlikely they could find me a job in my field. This sense of not fitting in and not having your skills and achievements valued by mainstream society prompted my art school cronies and I to refer to our degree as a "Bachelor of F... All".

For those graduates who survived the transition into the 'real world' and continued making work after art school, exhibiting meant renting a space in a commercial building or showing your work in a café or a friend's house – the idea of being picked up by a gallerist was nothing more than a dream for young artists then.

Happily, more than three decades later, the art world is now well and truly professionalised – it's just as likely to be referred to as an 'industry', no different from, say, construction or agriculture, as a 'profession'. Now dealers circle end-of-year art school graduate shows like hungry sharks, looking for the hottest young artists and offering them a chance to exhibit in the early stages of their careers.

Whether you have a burning desire to be a practising artist, to work in a gallery or museum, or to take up another of the myriad roles available in this 'industry', gaining a tertiary qualification is a smart idea. As well as offering a rich experience – for me it was a profound, life-changing activity – going to art school can open the door to many exciting professional opportunities. Cultivating Aotearoa's heritage

The Whitireia Toi Poutama programme offers raranga (weaving) and whakairo (carving) specialisations



Toi Poutama has been offered as a Bachelor of Applied Arts major at Whitireia since 2013, and is delivered in collaboration by the Arts and Te Wānanga Māori Faculties. Under the tutelage of renowned artist, Kohai Grace and master carver, Sam Hauwaho, students explore the traditional practices and techniques of raranga (traditional Māori weaving) or whakairo (traditional Māori carving), and gain confidence in the complementary skills of business, curatorship, exhibition practices and taonga management.

Students and graduates of the programme will learn to demonstrate excellence in their chosen field of weaving or carving and will showcase an understanding of tikanga Māori through the application of their art practice. Students will also contribute to the revival and survival of ancient Māori art practice as well as its evolution, and will apply relevant Māori language to their major discipline.

Photography's wide reach

Rachel H. Allan, darkroom alchemist and collector and purveyor of light, studied at the Dunedin School of Art at Otago Polytechnic in the undergraduate programme. She continued into postgraduate study and was awarded a Master of Fine Arts with Distinction, and now lectures in photography at Dunedin School of Art. Allan's extensive research practice and commitment implicate a wide reach of photography through digital and alternative liquid form.

Allan exhibits locally and internationally, in public museums, project galleries and artist-run spaces. Her work was selected for the Dunedin Public Art Gallery's exhibition, *Ridiculous Sublime*.

In a biannual collaboration with the Law Faculty at the University of Otago, Allan's work is currently on show in *Art in Law XVI: Animal Advocates*, which runs until November and features work from students, alumni and staff of the

The 'unicorn' creative

The Creative Technologies department at the Western Institute of Technology at Taranaki (WITT) offers students an opportunity to work both individually and collaboratively in a large atrium space. Specialist studios in printmaking, photography, fabrication and animation branch off the main atrium, with natural light dispersed through high roof windows.





Many students transition

from Certificates into the Diploma in Creative Technologies. The emergence of interdisciplinary practice in senior work highlights the slippage between disciplines and the experimental nature of creativity today. With local industries seeking a 'unicorn' student (confident in web, print, design, video and creative media), the department is valued for those graduates who cross-pollinate ideas within commercial contexts.

A recent success is 2010 WITT photography graduate, Thomas Busby who was awarded New Zealand Landscape Photographer of the Year (2016) by the New Zealand Institute of Professional Photography.

At risk, but with hope

What does Auckland's Greys Avenue, which is at risk of demolition, have to do with a Jakarta apartment block and a modernist Dutch complex boasting a community of 150 nationalities? They're all a part of artist Dieneke Jansen's latest project and exhibition, *Dwelling on the Stoep*, which seeks to ask questions around 'failed' state housing.


Jansen, a Senior Lecturer in AUT's Visual Arts Programme, shines the light on political attitudes, failures and hopes, combining video and photographs with text to provide context. Jansen visited the three sites, meeting occupants and documenting the spaces and communities.

Dwelling on the Stoep showed at AUT's ST PAUL St Gallery from 10 June to 10 July, 2016, and was complemented by an event on 2 July, when Jansen collaborated with No Fixed Abode (NFA) Homeless Radio, interviewing residents of the apartments.




