A Request was received from the Defendants dated 10 March 2016;

(a) which certified that the Claimant had failed to comply with the Order dated 3 February 2016 that:

1. The Claimant shall by 4pm on 9 March 2016 pay to the Defendants the sum of £225,000 as security for their costs of the two claims, such security either to be paid into Court or provided to the reasonable satisfaction of the Defendants' solicitors.
2. The claims shall be stayed (save in respect to any such application as is referred to in paragraph 4 below) until the security referred to in paragraph 1 above has been made or provided.
3. If the security referred to in paragraph 1 above has not been made or provided by 4pm on 9 March 2016, the claims shall each be struck out with judgment entered for the Defendants forthwith and for the Defendants to be paid their costs of the claims on the standard basis if not agreed.

4. There shall be liberty to apply as to the method of payment or provision of the security referred to in paragraph 1 above.
5. The Claimant shall by 4pm on 17 February 2016 pay the Defendants' costs of and occasioned by their application for security for costs, including the reserved costs of the adjourned hearing of 8 December 2015, summarily assessed in the sum of £45,000.

and that his claims be struck out, and

(b) requesting judgment to be entered against the Claimant.

IT IS ORDERED that there be judgment as follows:

1. Both of the Claimant's claims are struck-out.
2. The Claimant shall pay the Defendants' costs of the claims, to be assessed on the standard basis if not agreed.
