

gives the government broad authority to buy up toxic mortgage-related investments and other distressed assets from tottering financial institutions. The revised version adds on \$110 billion in tax breaks designed to attract additional support. The measure also lifts, from \$100,000 to \$250,000, the cap on government bank deposit insurance. The Securities and Exchange Commission will ease accounting rules that require financial institutions to show the deflated value of assets on their balance sheets.

amherst murder trial Wright contradicts testimony against him

Defendant denies love triangle, shooting man

AMHERST - DefendantTimothy Wright Jr. testified Friday, in the third day of his murder trial, to contradict $2\frac{1}{2}$ days of testimony against him by taking himself out of the love triangle prosecutors claim was the motive behind the slaying.

Wright, 22, is accused of chasing down and shooting 19-year-old Justin Baumgardner on May 3 as he fled a southern Amherst County park where the two men are alleged to have had an argument over Nicole Turpin, a then 17-year-old girl they had both allegedly dated.

Wright is charged with first-degree murder, shooting at an occupied vehicle, shooting from a vehicle and use of a firearm in the commission of a felony. In earlier statements and testimony, Commonwealth's Attorney Marsha Garst used a phone call from Turpin to Wright that day letting him know she'd be meeting Baumgardner in the park that night as the point where Wright's jealousy turned to homicidal rage.

TASHINGTON — With the economy on the brink of meltdown and elections looming, a reluctant Congress abruptly reversed course and approved a historic \$700 billion government bailout of the battered financial indus-



try on Friday. President Bush swiftly signed it. NO The 263-171 House vote

capped two weeks of tumult in Congress and on Wall Street,

punctuated by urgent warnings from Bush that the country confronted the gravest economic disaster since the Great Depression if lawmakers failed to act.

"We have acted boldly to help prevent the crisis on Wall Street from becoming a crisis in communities across our country," Bush said shortly after the plan cleared Congress, although he conceded, "our economy continues to face serious challenges."

His somber warning was underscored on Wall Street, where enthusiasm over the rescue gave way to worries about obstacles still facing the economy, and the Dow Jones industrials dropped 157 points.


