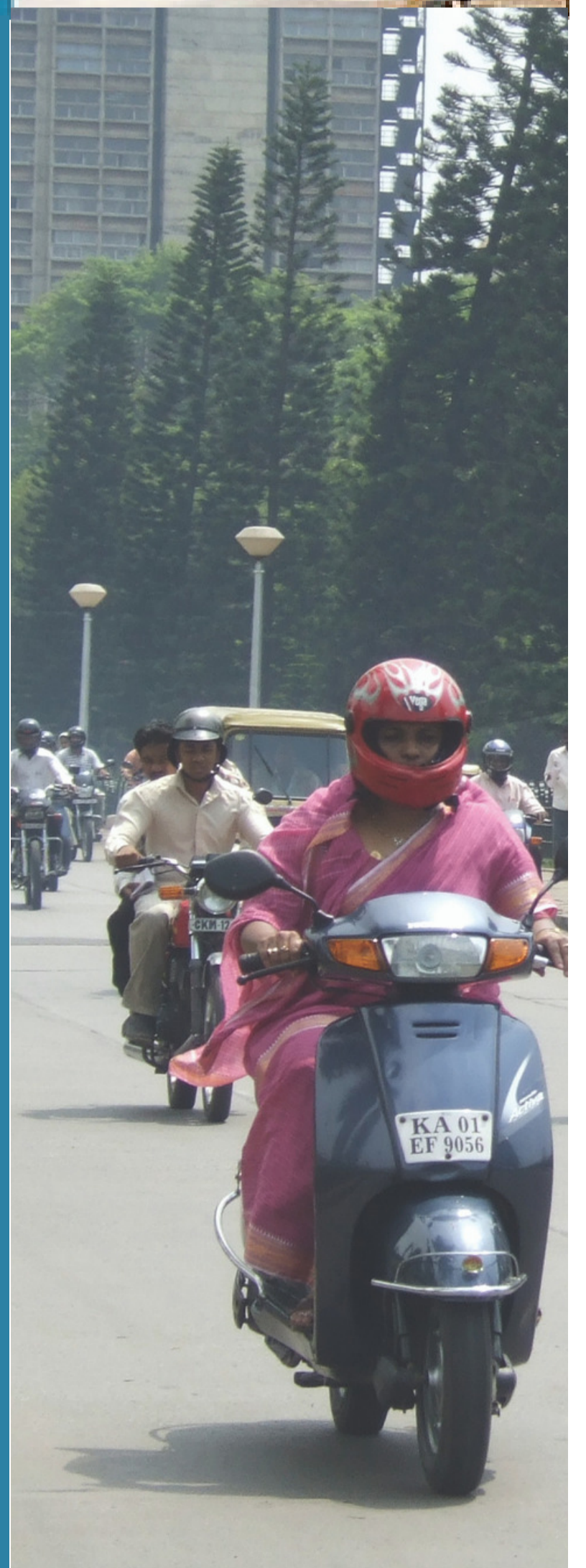

Presented by hip-hop star Akala, Poetry: Between The Lines - The Romantics explores the poetry of the romantic period through the work of Wordsworth, Byron, Blake, Shelley and Keats.
