The cost of this measure is partially offset by \$3.8 million from within the existing resourcing of the Australian Federal Police.

This measure includes \$6.3 million in expense funding for project management and consultancy services.

This development is conditional on the Australian Capital Territory Government agreeing to cede, at no cost, the ownership of roads and road reserves associated with the Griffin Legacy development around the Parliamentary Triangle and Dunrossil Drive to the Australian Government.

This measure includes \$13.0 million in expense funding over four years for the maintenance of these roads.

The Government will provide \$12.5 million over three years to redevelop the eastern precinct of the Australian War Memorial to improve school and visitor access, safety and parking. The east precinct redevelopment includes the building of a 200 space underground car park with a tunnel link to the Memorial, bus parking and a commemorative courtyard.

This project will complete the site redevelopment, complementing other major construction work at the Australian War Memorial. Over the last ten years the Government has provided the Australian War Memorial with over \$25 million for site redevelopment, including the building of Anzac Hall and the CEW Bean Building as well as redevelopment of major exhibitions such as World War II, the Aircraft Hall, the Research Centre and, currently, the post-1945 galleries.
