OUT HUNTING FOR KANGAROOS

One day, my brother Barayuwa and I myself Mirritji went out hunting for kangaroo. Early in the norming we came round the hillside and we stopped and painted our bodys with wet sand (Kabininge) to make us look like the brown antbed. So the kangaroo could not see us as a blackman(Yol), or smell us, or see the spears(djarak) and run away from them.

Following the hills:

Nearby there were cliffs(bukal) and flat valley (burdjerre) and springs (djulak) running onto the river nouth. So we followed the billabongs and swamps, the jungle and the stoney country. We walked to the side of the small nountain, looked around the countryside, and brother Barayuwa saw a big brown rock kangaroo(called in Jinang name 'Gandayala') lying down behind a big tall, cool shady, white gum tree in some long green grass.

Did not see the kangaroo:

I did not see the kangaroo, because I was only a small boy, about
14 years old. My brother Barayuwa was much older than me. He was a big
Stoneage man (wana) who had seen about 25 wet seasons. He told me the
kangaroo was there, and he said 'Stop! The kangaroo is there, and you had
better put your head down and bend your back low and follow behind me.

Crouching down:

We crouched down and crept up very quietly and slowly - left leg forward one step! right leg in the air, looking for a place on the ground that will make no noise. Barayuwa's right foot touched the ground and he stopped.

The hooked woonera:

He took his hooked woomera (bunduk) and brushed the flies away, because they could take his smell to the kangaroo, who would run away from it. He said with his hand, 'You had better stop. Devil - spirits (Wigili) make the kangaroo stand still. Do not frighten him because I am very close and I want to kill him for my food'

His najic right hand:

My brother Barayuwa turned round to me and he said with his right hand (the same hand which made the kangaroo stand still. 'You have to sit down very quietly and do not make any rattles'.

SCHOOL VISITORS:


