

A REMINDER of the big day Saturday 7th March, opening of the new Co-op by kr H. Giese.

<u>ADTHURS</u> - don't forget the baby competition that Sister Tilley is running on that day, excellent prizes for the winners both mother and baby. Also the fashion parade jointly in the hands of ars Armstrong and Miss Strong.

HOUSING - Approval has been given to the Co-op Society's Housing scheme, and we will begin building shortly after the completion of the new store, our first batch will comprise 50 units.

FROM INSIDE THE STORE: Maintenance is a real problem in such an isolated area and we have to secure the services of a mechanic from as far away as Adelaide to service our refridgeration.

At the new store food will be sold from the southern counter only, and those requiring clothing will move around to the northern counter, and similarly those commencing at the northern counter will move around to meet their various needs.

All Chayles from Government sources will be changed at the post office enclosure within the store, adjacent to the northern entrance.

STOWAGE OF GOODS - All goods will be loaded direct from the boat into the bulk store which enables the trucks to drive right into the building, and stock will se loaded onto pallets, giving circulation of air underneath and greatly assisting with pest control. The hunting season is asset upon us, we registered 6 guns last Friday alone and have another load enerouts.

A big stock of FRESH MATS to hand this week. When our second cold room is in operation (any day now) we will stock larger supplies of fruit and vegetables, indeed we have the first orders placed for tomatoes, lettuce peaches, grapes etc. via Tulleys Adelaide.

SIMPLE SCONDMICS - It is a fact that our CLOTHING PRICES are cheap r than Darwin, simply because our mark up is 55%, Darwin (all stores) 50% thich is the usual clothing margin.

Now to FOOD - Darwin prices are wholesale plus 12% margin of profit, our prices are wholesale, plus 10% snipping freight (Darwin to Maningrida) 12% Marine Insurance. So that in effect we can only at bear virtually break even with Darwins retail price before we make a margin of profit at all, such is the importance to the European community of their freight free aircraft, however there is no doubt that we will get even closer to these Darwin prices, by a variety of methods, buying in a more direct basis, containerisation of goods ex Perth, etc. a reduction in freight rates because of containerisation, a substantial stock less reduction, through better refrigeration and storage conditions.


