#### **Production history**

These recordings were collected between 15 June 1978 and 25 July 1979 by Dr Wayne Atkinson at Shepparton, Healesville, Melbourne and Framlingham, Victoria. Dr Atkinson was funded by an AIAS grant, the purpose of which was to examine the effects of reserves on the lives and cultures of Victorian Aboriginal people. Interviewees include Violet Harrison, Frank Endycot, Olly McCartney, Joy Murphy, Elizabeth Hoffman, Merle Jackomos, Margaret Tucker, Geraldine Briggs and Mary Clarke of the Yari Yari, Woiwurrung, Daungwurrung, Yorta Yorta and Wemba Wemba people. The collection was deposited at AIATSIS on the 19 September 1979.
