Production history

These recordings were collected between 1982 and 10 December 1986 by Audrey Bolger during field work at Wangkajunga (Christmjas Creek) and Moola Bulla in the Kimberley region of Western Australia. They record the lifestyle and community activities of women and some men who had recently moved from a traditional life in the desert to reside on pastoral stations. They also document the women's law (Mala) ceremony. The interviewees and performers include Majida (Midgie Thomas), Realla (Nyanga), Dora Kwilla (Jakapa), Molly Mungaya, Jewess James (Milginyan), Mary Nelly, Ruby Long, Violet Jimbadi, Eva Lawford, Myabur (Elsie Thomas), Jimmy James (Wirili), Mayan (Julia Lawford), Mary Jarju, Nellie Jambi, Olive Bieundurry, Bruno Smith, Toby, Dick, Colin Barrett, Jugaja, Yirlpirra, Jugaja, Rosie Nammra, Yangunya, Freda James and Bridget Martindale.
