This collection of photocopies of diaries and correspondence relating to the Methodist Overseas Missions of Milingimbi and Croker Island (island missions 500km east and 220km northeast of Darwin respectively) was deposited in the AIATSIS Library by Douglas and Hazel Peterson in November 1984.

Included in the collection is an official diary (1953) and a personal notebook describing aspects of daily life in the Methodist Overseas Mission at Milingimbi. There is also official correspondence covering mission problems, supplies and staff relations, loading lists and accounts.

 - Daily routine of mission: construction and maintenance of buildings, farm management, store rationing
 - Work relations with mission Aborigines and names of confrontations and disciplinary measures
 - Medical details births, deaths, accidents and wounds inflicted, incidents of Hansen's disease (Leprosy)
 - Translation of Sunday morning service, church duties
 - Miscellaneous [loose leaf] notes including typescript poem
- Personal diary notebook giving a record of impressions and experiences in Darwin, September-October 1952, and Croker Island (including disputes), November 1954-July 1955

Series 3 Personal correspondence, 1952-55

This series includes photocopies of personal handwritten letters and typescript copies of letters from Douglas Peterson and his wife Hazel while they were living at the mission stations of Milingimbi and/or Croker Island with their three young children. The bulk of the letters are sent to Douglas Peterson's mother with a small number sent to other Peterson family members. The series also includes a few letters received by Douglas Peterson.

The correspondence includes descriptions of the domestic and official life on mission; rough sketches of buildings and island layout; details of agricultural pursuits, diet, family development and activities; Aboriginal tribal ways, diet, rations, offences and disciplinary measures; reference to pressure from mainland Aborigines on mission Aborigines; marriages of Aborigines conducted in church; arrivals and departures of

mission staff; and letter from Beulah Lowe describing the preparation of an Aboriginal dance group from the mission for the Queen's visit to Toowoomba, 1954 and events on the day.
