#### **Production history**

These recordings were collected by naturalist Irynej Skira during fieldwork on Cape Barren Island and in Smithton, Scottsdale, Hobart and Launceston, Tasmania; and South Yarra and Reservoir in Victoria. The purpose of the field trips was to gather primary source material, by way of oral histories, for a social history of the mutton bird industry in Tasmania. Interviewees include Frank Jaeger, Walter Bentley, Herbie Nicholls, Karen Brown, Patsy Adam-Smith, Ray Boxer, Ruth Maynard, Kim Stonehouse, Pam Stonehouse, Robert Hughes, Sharon Hughes, Darcy Maynard and George. The collection was deposited with AIATSIS on 5 September 1989.
