Production history

These recordings were collected in March 1976 by musicologist Richard Moyle during the South Pacific Festival of Arts at Rotorua in New Zealand. Music from the Torres Strait, Tiwi Islands and Central Arnhem Land in Australia was performed as a part of the festival. Performers include Djoli Laiwanga, David Blanasi, Bertram Kantilla, Aloysius Pauntulura, Peter Wandjuk Marika, Willie Martin and unidentified Torres Strait Islanders and Tiwi people. The collection was deposited with the Australian institute of Aboriginal Studies (now AIATSIS) on 7 December 1976.
