IT is not every day that a hundred determined workers humble a multinational giant. But that's just what happened at Philip Morris in Melbourne in the dying moments of 1979.

The metal and electrical tradesmen at the plant defended two victimised orkmates and their trade union rights, despite violence and intimidation from plice and company thugs. The story of how they did it is full of lessons for the The tradesmen at Phillip Morris have long enjoyed good wages and

the tradesmen at running mortes have long employed good wages and conditions, because they have a strong union shop. One of the reasons is the leadership of steward John Kanadeas and the Closed Shop Committee.

In the latter months of 1979, an industrial dispute developed which the company seized on, hoping to break the union organisation on the job. It was a

apparent

Philip Morris offered a series of pay rises from mid-year. But most of them were more apparent than real, because the company wanted them subject to absorption into whatever rise came out of the Metal Trades Award.

First they placed bans on repair of new machinery. Then in early November

they escalated a bit. The tradesmen have every second Friday off work. On the Friday before Cup Day they informed management that any machines which broke down that day would not be repaired.

The next week, fitter John Anderson removed a shaft from one of the machines for repairs. John Karndeas discovered that this machine had broken down on Friday, and immediately placed a ban on the shaft. The shaft sat in the foreman's office until 13 November. Then the company







By 1977-78, the price of oil in real terms had fallen again — by 40 per cent. But, after a brief recovery, the major economies went back into recession.

The fall in the real cost of oil didn't stop other prices throughout the world increasing on average twice as fast as they had five years before.

A recent report by the Organisation of Economic - Co-operation and Development (OECD) pointed out that current worldwide consumption of energy is equivalent to 6

The US alone has enough coal to keep the world going for 200 years.

Well, why aren't these resources being used now?

We live in a capitalist world, in which nothing is done unless there is a profit in it.

So neither the seven great oil companies nor national governments will plough money into establishing new energy resources unless they're guaranteed substantial profits. That's why, in the early 1970s, both the Americans and the Japanese decided not to try to tap the huge oil reserves which

exist in remote parts of Siberia And that's why, in the last 20 years, Australian companies have shut down coal mines which still had coal in them

TEN YEARS is long enough. 800 is far too long. In 1968 the Catholics of Northern Ireland knew things would never be the same again. They wouldn't let them be. They'd had enough of the worst jobs, the worst housing, the worst unemployment. Change was

When the Civil Rights march of October 5, 1968 was battoned down, the Catholics didn't return cowed to the phettoes. They knew this time was different. The fight that







RALPH NADER, American consumer advocate, denounces "legal Frankensteins" at a big business convention in Washington earlier

RALPH NADER, renowned American consumer activist, arrived in Australia last week for an eight day speaking tour.

Nader wants to spark "national debates" on nuclear power, consumer rights, the power of the multinationals and government secrecy.

One of Nader's main messages in Australia has been a warning against the power of the multi-nationals. He has described how the giant mining companies turned Appalachia in the area, and warns us not to let them do

Nader's comments about Appalachia are certainly warranted, but like many Australian unions, he is over-estimating the significance of "shift to mining" in the Australian economy.

The Australian ruling class is not about to let its manufacturing industry wither away in fact, it is one of the most protected in the world.

Nader has had much success in his legal actions against the "excesses" of the corporate giants in this time. But these have blinded him to the fact that, while a wealthy capitalist nation has room for one or two skilful lawyers to engage in "clean up" campaigns, they are only

gadflies nipping at a very large beast. Nader's basic appeal to big business is to "start respecting longrange survival needs and rights of present and future generations."
