



In El Salvador, the implementation of this strategy has been necessarily brutal - involving the bombing of working class neighbourhoods and widespread political assassinations by the CIA-trained and supplied ORDEN paramilitary death squads, whose body count is around the 15,000 mark!

US interests have \$704 million invested in the region. But it is the military and geographic significance of Central America which chiefly concerns the US ruling class.

It is right smack in Uncle Sam's back yard for starters, and it is located on key routes from the world's richest oil regions. It contains busy sea routes of crucial commercial significance to the West (Panama Canal) and the area itself possesses rich oil and gas reserves as well as reserves of bauxite and other minerals.

Loss of control of this region would seriously affect Washington's strategic position vis a vis Russia, which has already set up shop in

All this is a good enough reason for Washington to go to any lengths to maintain its grip on the region. But there is another reason. If there is one thing that Washington fears more than their imperialist rivals, it is a working class revolu-



Why do officials sell out?

MOST WORKERS at Ford saw their union officials as being just as bad as the company. Some militants even advocated breaking away from the VBU so that they would not have to pay money to "those bludgers who don't serve our

Now given the role of the Federal VBU officials, Now given the rote of the Federal Vist officials, who did all they could to wreck the strike and the disgusting sell out by the state officials over the secret ballot, these views are understandable. But they leave two questions unanswered: why do officials sell out and what can militants do to prevent

these still outs? It is frempting to blame still outs on corrupt right wingers who make deals with the bosses behind the workers back. And it is true that there are plenty of grubs in the trade union movement. But the Victorian VBU officials are not right wingers — they are supporters of the Socialist Left of the ALP. Also the metalwarders who scaled do the health of the trade of

backing of the left wing AMMSO leadership of John Halfpenny and Jim Roudston. What is it then that explains the sellouts and betrayals of even left wing officials. To obtain some understanding we have to look at the role of trade union officials within capitalist society. Their main job is to negotiate between the two

sides in industry.

As well as negotiating on our behalf with the bosses. they are necessarily involved in making deals and compromises which they try to sell to us as the 'best' offer we can get. Their role is vital to the bosses who

need a reliable group of people to negotiate with and to discipline the work force.

In return for carrying out this vital role for capitalism, the officials obtain certain privileges—

from the working class.

As a separate social layer they have different interests to the mass of workers. And these differing interests must inevitably lead to conflict between

workers and bureaucrats.

It means that left wing officials, who on paper have 'better' politics than the majority of their members, can find themselves well to the right of even Liberal voters. when it comes to a particular compromise over wages.

Since the officials' privileged position depends on performing the role of keeping workers in line, anything that upsets this is regarded as a threat. So they view any independent action by the rank and file

BOOM GOING **BUST?**

THE WORLD economy is moving deeper into recession. This is most vividly reflected in the US where under the impact of "Reaganomics" unemployment in October jumped from 7.5% to 8.0% and where a further increase of 9% is expected.

The British and some other western European economies have been in deep trouble for sometime, but a generalised world slump has been prevented by the relative health of the US, German and Japanese economies.

In Detroit, the centre of the automobile industry, Depression style soup kitchens have reappeared in recent weeks. Initially many capitalist

economic experts had predicted that the downturn would be shortlived, but now they expect it to

continue well into next year.

The present US slump has had a heavy impact because many businesses had not recovered from the previous short sharp recession of mid-1980. This means that bankruptcies are likely to be higher than anything previously seen in the postwar period.

postwar period.
The only 'bright' spot for world capitalism is the continuing vitality of the Japanese economy. But the Japanese expansion is based on an export boom which threatens to

cripple its major rivals.

Already the EEC (European Economic Community), led by the formerly prosperous West Germans, and the US have begun putting pressure on the Japanese to curtail their exports.

The Australian economy has so far held up remarkably well in the face of the world downturn. The question is how long can the resources boom continue before the control of the presentational control of the presentation of the presentati being engulfed in the international

Given the dependence of the boom resources — coal, uranium, aluminium etc. on export markets, it is inevitable that demand for them will dive as the shock waves of the US slump spread throughout the

In any case the 'resources boom' has been of limited benefit to Australian workers. The giant Australian and multinational mining and resources manufac-turing companies have ripped off most of the new wealth in super profits.

There has only been a minimal increase in real wages while unemployment has hardly fallen at all. And given that new jobs in the resources based industries are concentrated in the construction phase (the mines and mineral processing plants will employ very few workers once they are built) unemployment is bound to rise

once the new projects come on line. But the world recession is threatening the very viability of many of these new projects. The impending glut on the aluminium market is making Alcoa's Portland

market is making Aleoa's Fortland plant a touch and go proposition whether or not the Victorian government massively subsidies its electricity charges.

The steel industry has already been severely hit. BHP is closing down its Kwinana, Western Australia plant, and carrying out cut backs in other states and threatening more.
