- * direct democracy & horizontalism
- * the Arab Spring
- * growing inequality of wealth / corporate take-over

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - shock of eviction - feelings of oppression - pressures of cost of living - curiosity - friends were also involved / family - participation in direct democracy - potential for broad-based support - inspired by indignado movement - support role for movement - interest in citizen's council - wanting to overthrow capitalism & smash the state! - meet people / get laid - wanting to save the world - wanting to get hope some response when the grand kids ask: "what were you doing when things went to shit in the early 2000s..." 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - didn't want to be apathetic - seemed possible + effect change - access to social media - unknown barriers because those who are most excluded are probably not here - lack of social connection - language - time constraints - personal conflict - lack of fixed timetable - exhausting time commitment - safety issues (internal + external) - work commitments ✓ - time commitment - social pressure to dedicate your life to Occupy - assumption that if you weren't there you weren't doing anything valuable. - lack of activities in the space - "occupy aristocracy" - low productivity on site - political differences in OWS - disillusionment
