COMRADES,—Being unable, through distance and expense, to send delegates to the International Congress, and in order to place before the Socialists of the world the position of the Socialist -movement in Australia, the following brief statement is submitted for your information by the Socialist Labor Party:

The population of this country is beween five and six millions -scattered over a great continent, though the greater part of it is concentrated in the arger cities - notably Sydney and Ma bourne. Australia's staple products are mainly pastoral, agricultural, and iniceral, with a growing lendency tohard a larger expansion of secondary production in its towns and cities. The evolution of capitalism in the direction or concentration and trustification is a marked feature of the country's industrial activities, thus keeping in line with tue modern industrial development that presents itself in every capitalist country. Consequently, there exists in Australia as elsewhere the inevitable class struggle and a condition of wageslavery-the natural concomitants of capitalism. Unemployment and insecurity faces the working class on every hands while the wage rate is steadily declining, as shown by the statistics ssued by the capitalist State statisticians. Female and child labor is on the increase, following the march of machinery nto factory and workshop.

Since the first Federal Parliament the Federal Labor Party has held the balance of power, and for a brief period of four months held the reigns of government, the leader of the party holding the position of Prime Minister of Australia; but, holding power only by the grace of bourgeoisie politicians, was defeated by the capitalist sections-Freetraders and Protectionists-combining together.

The policy and programme of the Labor parties-Federal and Statemerely radical and reformistic, denying the class-struggle and aiming at the perpetuation of capitalism and not its abolition.
