# INFLATION!

# What is the answer?

Rampant inflation now affecting all capitalist countries remains the main issue for the Australian Government, for the working class and for the trade union movement.

It wreeks living standards, makes a mockery of wage gains, puts bousing out of reach for low and middle licome carners, threatens unemployment, disrupts trade, aggravates the international monetary crisis and brings down governments.

is common ground that inhation is the main issue demand-ing the government's attention but it is not common ground that the cause of inflation springs from the deep going

ises of capitalism.

Prime Minister Whitlam was at one stage attempting to push the question aside on the grounds that it was a world-wide feature whose main cause in Australia arose from external factors beyond the control

Inflation is not world-wide. It non-existent in the Soviet Union and other socialist lands

Unless the Australian Labor Government realises that in-flation stems from basic causes flation stems from base causes within the capitalist economic system and takes steps for far-reaching controls of the economy, including extensive interference with the private profit making rights of the "free enterprise" system it will ot succeed in its efforts to curb

The traditional methods such The traditional methods such as control and restriction of capital imports, manipulation of the exchange rate, easing of tariffs and import quotas, reducing money supply by credit squeezes have not worked to solve inflation in any of the capitalist countries where they

have been tried and they will not

Inflationary rates in the capitalist countries vary up to as much as 23 per cent. In some of the less developed countries the rate is very much higher than this. So serious is this questhan this. So serious is this ques-tion that in recent weeks it has caused the downfall of govern-ments in Iceland, Canada and Italy. It is occurring in a period of developing economic crists

developing economic crisis.

CURRENCY COLLAPSE In January the "Financial Review" reported the tendency

to move "towards global currency collapse of the notorious Weimar type". This is a reference to the type of inflationary collapse which occurred in Germany in the early part of the 1920's. The article goes on: "Though it has happened in individual comhappened in individual coun-tries never before has the world a whole been ravaged by

inflation on such a scale."
In April the "Sydney Morning Herald" reported France's then Foreign Minister as saying that the world was in a state ing that the world was in a state of economic slow-down and that "not much would be needed to slip from a slow-down to recession and from there to a world crisis, to repercussions which would be catastrophic for all."

The UN Secretary-General addressing a special session of the General Assembly warned "of impending disaster unless the world immediately began tackling six major economic

#### INTEREST RATES

The measures at present applied by the Australian Government or under consideration have been applied elsewhere without success.

There has been the imposition

of a credit squeeze to bottle up excess money in circulation. One result of this has been to force up interest rates to pre-viously unheard of levels. The Melbourne "Herald" reports that most building societies are expected to raise their interest loans on houses from 10% per cent to 11% or even 12 per cent.

The paper reports a borrower who obtained \$22,000 nine months ago and started off repaying \$176 per month. The repayments have already gone up to \$213 and will now go up again. Out of the repayment, \$201 was in interest. The increase of interest rates reflects the financier's attempt to keen the financier's attempt to keep up with the rate of inflation but it becomes an unbearable burden for the home builder or

#### Profit, not people, must suffer

As a result of the Common-wealth Government cutting back grants to the State Governments at the recent Premiers' Conference the States are now actively discussing the imposi-tion of a consumer tax to make up the balance.

Mr Wran (ALP) and leader of Mr Wran (ALP) and leader of the Opposition in the NSW State Parliament says that "a consumption tax would not be progressive and equitable... it would hit the lower and middle income earners harder than it would those in the high income bracket."

A better proposal would be a wealth tax suggested by Dr Ironmonger in the article already referred to. He said: "The government can clamp-down on speculators by imposing a wealth tax on assets of more than \$100,000."

Other government measures already decided upon are the ending of the petrol price sub-sidy which has held down the price of petrol in country areas and a cut-back in expenditure by the PMG's Department and the lifting of postal and tele-

In each case the result is further increase prices with the manufacturer and big business-man merely passing on the increased charges to the consum-

While these limited fiscal and white these limited liseal and measures should be supported where they limit the inflationary spiral and protect the working people from its effects they will not bring it under control.

#### HEFTY PROFITS

Despite the pessimism of big business following the election of the Labor Government, the sharp drop in share values and sharp drop in share values and the high wage increases recently won by trade unionists the "Financial Review" of June 18 is able to report that: "Late last week some less than pessimistic noises were already being made full years profits are expected to be of hefty propor-tions."




