Rocketing gold:

Time bomb under workers' wages by Vic Williams

Rocketing gold prices are setting a time bomb under workers' pay packets. Not only are the prices of silver and platform rising with gold, but the price of litems that affect consumer goods, such as wood, sugar, copper and base metals are also rising fast.

While speculation and panic vine has had some influence, the new developing economic crisis in the USA has triggered

In the second quarter of 1979 the US GNP fell 2.3 per cent and continued to fall the following month.

Newsweek admitted the US was on the brink, or in a recession "created by the huge inflationary (prices) drain on consumer purchasing power," with householders using a third of their wages just to service time payments.

The spectacular rise in gold prices reveals that the US and other capitalist countries have

virtually lost control.

During and after World War
II, and up to 1971, the USA
was able to maintain an abnormally high rate for the dollar in relation to gold, pegsing the price at \$US\$5 an
ounce. As long as it was

The first major break came in December '71 with the first devaluation of the dollar. The huge cost of the Vietnam war on top of the cold war military expenditure which has continued to escalate, undermined the economic and political domination of the US.

These were partly effective for a time. But, when in September '79 the IMF put 400,000 ounces of gold on the market there were bids amount ing to 11/2 million ounces and the price went to \$US340 Later, when the US put 750,000 ounces on sales, there were bids amounting to 2.6 million ounces by a handful of big buyers. But the gap between the falling production and the in-creasing number of US dollars from the deficit budgeting for the huge military expenditures is widening to a chasm. No financial fiddling can bridge it. The gold price rise is a warn-

Land rights march in Adelaide by Hannah Middleton

South Australia, one of the first acts of the new Liberal Government was to announce that it would reconsider legis-lation giving land rights to the lation giving land rights to the Pitjantjatjara Aborigines. At the same time the green light was given for mining on Abor-iginal land in the state.

Urban and tribal Aborigines and non-Aborigines gathered outside Parliament House after the march to hear Jim Stanley, Chairman of the SA Aboriginal Legal Rights Council, Mick Miller, Chairman of the North Queensland Land Council, Dr. Hannah Middleton, Secretary of the NSW Trade Union ittee on Aboriginal Rights, Mrs Ruby Hammond, Executive Director of the SA Aboriginal Legal Rights Movement, Norman Foster, ALP parliamentarian in the state upper house, and a representative of the Pitjantiatiara Council.

CALL FOR UNITY

Speakers called for greater unity within black comm throughout the country and also underlined the need for unity between black and white in a common struggle against mon-opoly interests to win Aboriginal

rights.

It was pointed out that it was easy for multinational companies to get Australian land to rip up for profits but that the original owners, the Aborigines, find it impossible to regain control of any of their traditional land.



The urgent need for wider active solidarity with the Abor-iginal movement was stressed since the winning of Aboriginal rights is an important part of the fight for a better future

Several speakers pointed to several speakers pointed to the developing international support for the Aboriginal people and the recognition of their national liberation struggle as part of a growing world-

Mr Burdett, SA Liberal Minister for Community Wel-Minister for Community Wel-fare and representing the State Minister for Aboriginal Affairs, spoke to the meeting promising that the bill prepared by the previous Labor Government, would be presented to Parlia-ment but indicating that Cab-inet expected to amend it, reducing the power of the Pittjanijatjara to control their land

He made no mention of the clauses in the bill giving Aborigines the right to control mining on their land or of the land outside the Northwest Aboriginal Reserve which is being claimed by Aboriginal

UNITED STRUGGLE

The wage squeeze

What has the Fraser government done to the wage packet?

In 1975 when the Fraser government was elected the average veekly wage was \$135.

Note: Average weekly wage is more realistic than the figure for average weekly earnings because the latter figure includes the salaries of company managers and directors).

Now the average weekly wage is \$185. "Good," you will say, "wages are up by \$50 per week."

- * But to buy the same goods and services as were bought in 1975 now costs \$42.49 a week more. The cost of living has gone up \$42.49 since 1975.
- ★ After the final scrapping of Medibank and the need to revert to insurance payments, health costs will be \$11 per week more than in 1975.
- * Sales tax, including the cost of oil price rises (most of which goes to the government), has increased by \$8.32 per week. Sales tax up by \$8.32 since 1975.

The big tax transfer

Since 1975, Pay as you earn (PAYE) taxes on workers have risen in real terms (that means the figures are discounted for the effect of inflation) by 22 per cent or a total of \$2,173 million at current dollar values.

In the same period tax in real terms on companies has fallen by 7 per cent or \$250 million at current dollar values.

Tax on professional and self-employed has risen in real terms by 4 per cent or \$111 million at current dollar values.



This is not the only aspect of the rip-off. Government spending on workers and their families for health care, housing and social welfare has been severely cut, while subsidies, allowances and grants

The Moldavian experience

Imagine the Barossa Valley, the Hunter River vineyards or parts of the Murray lands grape or fruitgrowing areas as one big vineyard or orchard and you arrive at the same impression on a visit to Moldavia at this time of the year.

This little Socialist Republic Institute Socialist Republic nestling in between the Ukraine and Rumania in the southwest of the USSR is clad in greenery. Unbroken plantings of vines covering undulating country, fenceless, as far

Travelling through the coun-try one finds relief in wooded oak groves or in vast orchards belonging to an amalgamation of collective and state farms and scientific institutes.

Punctuated throughout the hinterland too are other "com-plexes" — big industrialised cattle breeding stations, or pig farms, poultry 'factories,' con-

Evidence of irrigation, reticulated by underground pipes from scattered pumping stations is seen watering huge fields of sunflower and lucerne. The black rich earth of people's Moldavia is as bountiful as the sunshine which warms it to

The broad green stripe run-ning though Moldavia's national flag and the rising sun over bunches of grapes in its emblem truly reflect the character of this flourishing little Republic

not only because of its contri-bution to the general economy but, more significantly, because of the example it has set the whole country in agricultural organisation and large-scale

Specialisation, which is part of the process, is reflected in the huge regions of single crops, orchards or vineyards.

The hitherto multi-branch farms, despite their relatively large size, no longer were adequate to accommodate the latest scientific and technological revolution. New forms were needed even in the design and supply of machinery.

Of course modern farms in capitalist countries use plenty of machinery but all too often it is designed for individual use and includes ingenious, handy, small tools. Socialist farming demands land lay-out, integration and specialisation to meet the needs of large-scale application of the latest mechanical methods.
