FREE TILLET!!!

Robert Tillet, a 19 year old former Adelaide student was arrested on last Saturday for painting the letters 'R' and 'B' on a sign that read 'FREE ZARB'. Tillet pleaded guilty to the charge of having painted on a railway bridge in Northcote.

Mr Pfeifer, S,M. told Tillet that he was sentincing him to the maximum term and gave him no option.

Pfeifer was the same magistrate who fined Ken Mansell, a Monash student and Adrian Desailly, a young worker \$200, last Tuesday for painting the same sign.

The sentence imposed on Tillet who is now released pending an appeal seems extremely harsh, even within this legal system.
