MINING INTOLISIGENCE.

(By our Special Reporter.) THE GRAVEL PITS .- Some time ago, considerable excitement prevailed on the Gravel Pits, relative to the sanguine expectations formed of the satisfactory working of the steam engine, and its consequent effect upon the present mode of operations on the Ballarat diggings generally, and on the Gravel Pits in particular. We are sorry to say, that up to the present time, its operations have been abortive, and the engine has not answered to the high expectahous formed of it. 
