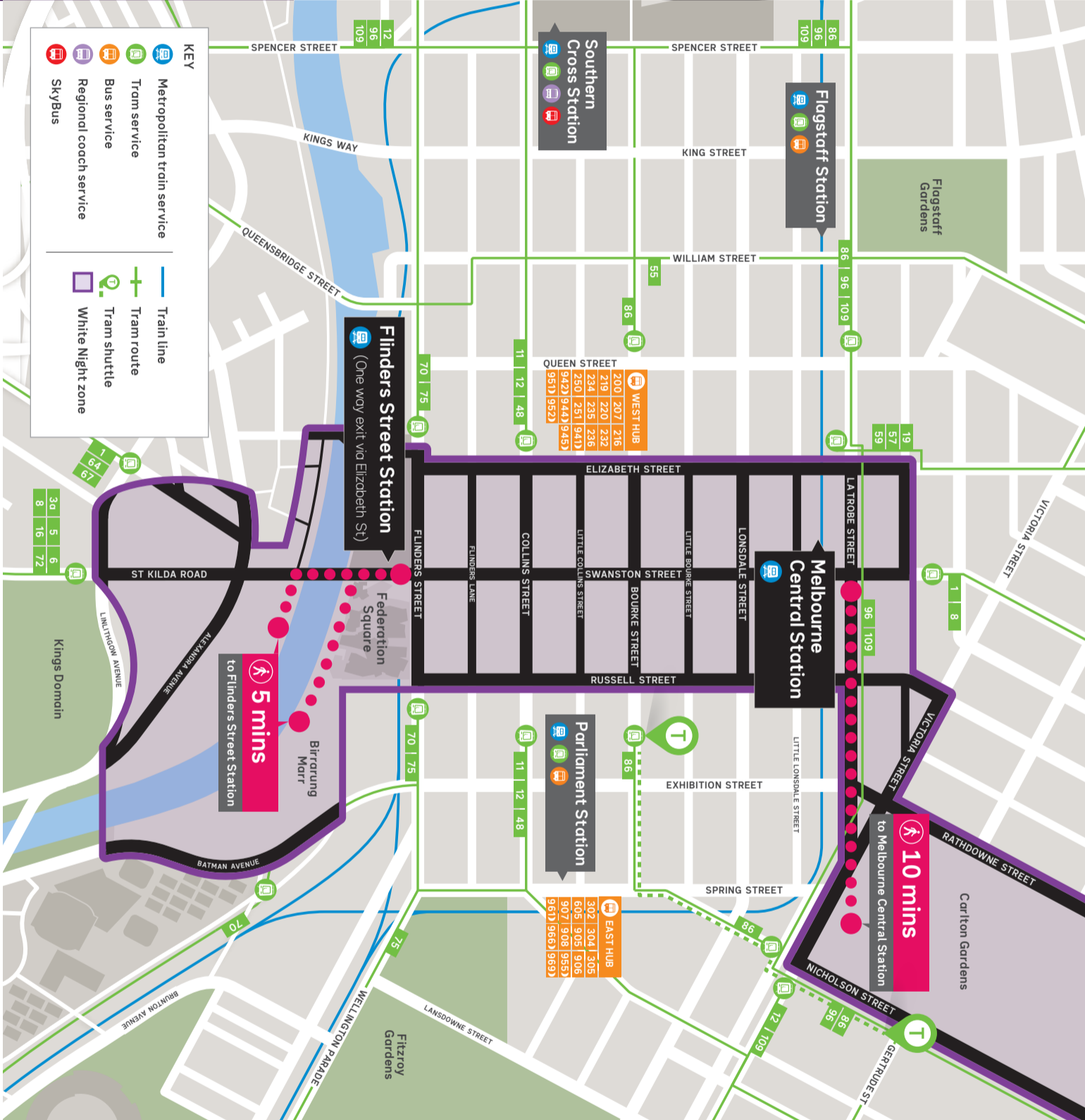

Getting Around

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Public transport is the easiest way to get to White Night. Trains, trams and buses are running all night long so you won't miss a thing! Just top up your myki before you travel, and touch on when you board to travel with a valid ticket.

BUS

Night Bus services and Route 907 (to Doncaster Park + Ride) run from 1.30am–6.30am. Due to road closures, all CBD buses will operate from the West Bus Hub on Queen Street and from the East Bus Hub in Spring Street from 5pm on Saturday until 8am on Sunday.

METROPOLITAN TRAIN

All lines running. City Loop train stations open all night. Consider Melbourne Central Station to avoid congestion at Flinders Street Station. From 7pm–3am, trains every 15–30 mins. From 3am–6.30am, trains every 60 mins. Flinders Street Station will have a one way exit via Elizabeth Street and Southbank. Lifts at Parliament and Flagstaff stations will not be available.

TRAM

All routes running all night apart from 35, 78 and 82. From 5pm–1am, trams every 5–10 mins. From 1am–3am, trams every 15–20 mins. From 3am–7.30am, trams every 30 mins.

REGIONAL COACH

Night Coaches depart from Southern Cross Coach Terminal at 2am to Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Seymour and Traralgon.

TAXIS

The Flinders Street station taxi rank and other prominent taxi ranks along Swanston Street and surrounding roads will be closed on the night, due to surrounding road closures. Temporary taxi zones will be established on the perimeter of the event precinct and also at the location of the existing city mega rank - 131 Queen Street between Collins & Bourke. Existing taxi ranks outside of the perimeter that can still operate as normal include are Crown Casino and 50 Bourke Street (near Spring Street).

ROAD CLOSURES

Road closures throughout the city have been determined to ensure safe and easy pedestrian movements. Access in and out of the CBD will be restricted to emergency services only from 5pm Saturday 18 February until 8am Sunday 19 February 2017. A full schedule of road closures is available on the website. Thank you to Victoria Police, Public Transport operators and Public Transport Victoria, City of Melbourne, Ambulance Victoria and all other organisations involved for their support and consultation in the planning of the 2017 event.

HOW TO ENJOY YOUR WHITE NIGHT

White Night Melbourne is a popular public event, so spend time planning how you will get there and when. It goes from Saturday 7pm to Sunday 7am - so there is a lot of time experience the city in a way you haven't before.

Many of the projection works are best viewed after dark (see our full program) so the later you come the more you will probably see! The event runs until 7am - with food and drink and venues and galleries open til this time too - why not set the alarm for Sunday morning and come in then!

- Larger scale works are located in the Gardens - get off at Melbourne Central for access to Carlton Gardens and the State Library
 - Information, lost children and first aid facilities are indicated on the map. If you require assistance, look for the uniformed White Night Guest Services staff or security staff stationed throughout the event precinct.
 - Toilets, accessible toilets and baby change stations are indicated on the map. Look for the White Night Guest Services staff if you require assistance.
 - Melbourne Museum, The State Library of Victoria, Melbourne Central, Southgate, Federation Square, ACMI, The Arts Centre and the NGV will be open with facilities available to the public.
 - Participating restaurants, cafes, food courts and food trucks will be open from 7pm–7am. Visit whitenightmelbourne.com.au for details.
 - Free drinking water is available at locations around the city. If it's a hot night, we recommend you bring your own refillable water bottle.
 - All public areas of White Night Melbourne are alcohol free. It is an offence within the City of Melbourne to consume or carry opened alcohol in public areas.
