Appoint Deputy Registered Officer

- A registered officer or deputy registered officer can nominate the party's endorsed candidates in a Federal election. An appointment takes a few days to be available to AEC Returning Officers throughout Australia, so any new appointment form should be lodged with the AEC well before the close of nominations in an election.
- An appointment can be withdrawn by the registered officer by signed letter to the AEC, or below.
- Further information is provided in the <u>Party Registration Guide</u> available at <u>www.aec.gov.au</u>
- The information requested on this form is collected under the Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918.
- The name of the deputy registered officer is made public on the AEC's website.
