INTRODUCTION

The purpose of Budget Paper No. 4 is to provide a whole-of-government view of appropriations required by entities in the Budget year and their estimated staffing, expenses and net capital investment.¹ The Paper contains three parts with tables of information as follows:

1. Agency resourcing – Appropriations required by Agencies
 - 1.1 Total resourcing by source of appropriation
 - 1.2 Estimated expenditure from special appropriations (other than special accounts)
 - 1.3 Estimated cash flows and balances for special accounts
2. Staffing of Agencies
3. Expenses and net capital investment
 - 3.1 Departmental expenses by Agency
 - 3.2 Net capital investment by Agency

Parts 2 and 3 are tables of information that were contained in Budget Paper No. 1 Statement 6 in prior year Budgets. They are now provided as part of Budget Paper No. 4 to bring together key entity level information.²

Information is contained in tables organised by portfolio and then by entity, providing estimates for the Budget year and previous year.

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- 1 References to ‘entity’ in Budget Paper No. 4 are references to agencies under the *Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997*, bodies under the *Commonwealth Authorities and Companies Act 1997*, and the High Court of Australia.
 - 2 The Portfolio Budget Statements (PB Statements) provide further details of the estimated payments under each of the annual Appropriation Bills and other legislation providing appropriations. Agencies report against the approved list of outcomes and programmes for which they are responsible. They also provide details of estimated receipts from other sources, including taxation, customs, excise and receipts from fees and charges collected by entities. Agencies also include their programmes’ objectives; financial and non-financial performance, including deliverables; and key performance indicators for each programme.

Introduction

MACHINERY OF GOVERNMENT CHANGES

The Administrative Arrangements Order (AAO) on 18 September 2013 resulted in various machinery of government (MoG) changes. The Departments of State abolished were the Department of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations; the Department of Regional Australia, Local Government, Arts and Sport; and the Department of Resources, Energy and Tourism. Departments of State established were the Department of Education and the Department of Employment. Departments of State in the first column below were renamed to those listed in the second column:

These MoG changes resulted in the transfer of legislative responsibility and related functions from previous Departments to those newly established or renamed. The MoG changes also resulted in the transfer of legislative responsibility and related functions between various agencies. Footnotes and explanatory notes are used to reference and explain the effects of the various transfers of function and related resourcing.

Resource management reforms

On 1 July 2014, the *Public Governance, Performance and Accountability Act 2013* (PGPA Act) is expected to replace the *Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997* and the *Commonwealth Authorities and Companies Act 1997* as the Commonwealth's primary resource management legislation.

Introduction

Public resource management under the PGPA Act represents a cultural change from a compliance approach to a principles based framework. Commonwealth entities are encouraged to consider how they manage resources, based on the following principles:

- government should operate as a coherent whole;
- a uniform set of duties should apply to all resources handled by entities;
- performance of the public sector is more than financial; and
- engaging with risk is a necessary step in improving performance.

The Budget materials have been prepared by reference to existing legislation and frameworks. Transitional legislation, anticipated to be introduced in the Budget sittings, will address any changes required to implement the PGPA Act.

Part 1: Agency Resourcing — Appropriations required by Agencies

PART 1: AGENCY RESOURCING — APPROPRIATIONS REQUIRED BY AGENCIES

APPROPRIATIONS

An appropriation is a legal entitlement to spend money from the Consolidated Revenue Fund (CRF). Appropriations can be classified as annual appropriations or special appropriations. Annual appropriations are contained in the annual Appropriation Acts. Special appropriations are contained in Acts, other than the annual Appropriation Acts, with some aspects also appearing in specific legislative instruments (such as applies to Special Accounts established, under the FMA Act, by disallowable determinations of the Finance Minister).

The CRF is a concept established in section 81 of the Australian Constitution to represent all Commonwealth money. The CRF is formed of all revenues or moneys raised or received by the Executive Government of the Commonwealth. All moneys paid to the Commonwealth, or any person or organisation acting on behalf of the Commonwealth, automatically form part of the CRF. Money forms part of the CRF upon receipt by, or on behalf of, the Commonwealth, regardless of whether the money is credited a bank account. This covers taxes, charges, levies, borrowings, loan repayments and moneys held in trust.

Section 83 of the Constitution provides that no money shall be drawn from the Treasury of the Commonwealth except under an appropriation made by law. Section 81 provides that all appropriations from the CRF must be for the purposes of the Commonwealth. The ‘Treasury’ of the Commonwealth, noted in section 83, equates to the CRF referred to in section 81. Together, sections 81 and 83 provide that there must be an appropriation, made by law, for the purposes of the Commonwealth, before money may be spent. This is a key element of the provisions which safeguard Parliament’s control over Australian Government spending.

Table 1.1 refers to certain non-appropriated amounts where Parliament has authorised an entity to retain an amount received from an external source, including another agency, or where the entity can retain and re-use those receipts based on its own governance structure. An example of this is a Commonwealth company under the CAC Act. Strictly, where the entity is an FMA Act agency, this authorisation is an appropriation for that expenditure. For other entities, such as a Commonwealth authority under the CAC Act, its enabling legislation would allow it to retain and re-use the relevant receipt.

Three Departments of State were abolished in the MoG changes in 2013-14. These Departments do not appear in the Agency Resourcing Tables as the tables describe the total income and receipts of all agencies and other bodies that receive appropriations from the Parliament in 2014-15.

Part 1: Agency Resourcing – Appropriations required by Agencies

More generally, the estimated actuals, printed in italics, represent the amounts appropriated in the 2013-14 annual Appropriation Acts, as affected by amounts that have been transferred between agencies as part of MoG changes, adjustments such as Advances to the Finance Minister and reductions by the Finance Minister, and in some instances limits applied administratively by the Department of Finance. For these reasons, the estimated actuals figures may be different from the sum of amounts provided in earlier Appropriation Acts, and do not provide comparator information for any agencies abolished in 2013-14.

For further details on how the MoG changes impact on individual portfolios refer to their 2014-15 Portfolio Budget Statements.

1.1 Total resourcing by source of appropriation

Table 1.1 shows, by portfolio and by entity, and for expenses by outcome,¹ the estimated amounts of money that entities are expected to have available for their activities during the budget year. The amounts are broken down by the different sources of funding: the annual Appropriation Bills; special appropriations; non-appropriated Special Account receipts and other non-appropriated receipts that entities are eligible to retain and spend.

The table also shows appropriations provided for Departmental and Administered purposes. Departmental appropriations are available to meet costs over which an agency has substantial control. They typically cover employee expenses; supplier expenses; and other operational expenses (such as interest and finance expenses). Administered appropriation items are those administered by the agency on behalf of the government. They typically cover activities governed by eligibility rules and conditions established by the government or Parliament such as grants, subsidies and benefit payments. Agencies therefore have less discretion over how administered operating costs are incurred as they are appropriated separately for outcomes.

Although the annual appropriation amounts are specified exactly, the majority of the amounts entities expect to spend from special appropriations, special accounts and receipts are estimates based on models of client demand etc. The presentation of cash receipts and special account receipts are displayed in separate columns:

- the column headed ‘Agency/CAC receipts’ shows estimates of non-appropriated receipts that entities are authorised to retain and spend in 2014-2015 by portfolio, entity and outcome;² and
- the column headed ‘Special Accounts’ shows estimated special account receipts that are not directly appropriated to those accounts also by portfolio, entity and outcome. The amount shown is the total for both departmental and administered special accounts in each outcome.

For each of the different sources of funding, Table 1.1 also includes a figure for the previous financial year as a comparison, labelled the ‘Estimated Actual’. It is printed in italics under each estimated amount for the Budget year. In relation to the Appropriations Bills, the Estimated Actual is the same as the Actual Available Appropriation. For special appropriations, special accounts and entity receipts, the Estimated Actual amounts are the estimated actual amounts published in the PB Statements.

2 ‘Non-appropriated receipts’ represents amounts initially derived from a source external to the relevant entity.

Part 1: Agency Resourcing – Appropriations required by Agencies

Note that, because some entities provide funding to others, the total amounts in Table 1.1 cannot be used to calculate total resourcing at the whole of government level. Similarly, transactions between entities while shown in financial statements of individual agencies, are eliminated in the Commonwealth's consolidated financial statements. The inclusion of all real and notional transactions in Table 1.1 is in accordance with section 5 of the Annual Appropriation Acts, which states that notional transactions between agencies are treated as real transactions, even though the amounts do not leave the CRF.

Note also that estimates of expenditure from special appropriations are shown against the agency whose Minister is responsible for administration of the Act concerned. This may not necessarily be the agency that actually spends the money – agencies are able to spend money from special appropriations that are the responsibility of a Minister in another portfolio through the operation of drawing rights issued under the FMA Act.

Table 1.1 also includes estimates of non-appropriated receipts into special accounts including receipts of special public money (which includes amounts held on trust or otherwise on behalf of another person).

1.2 Estimated Expenditure from Special Appropriations (other than Special Accounts)

Special appropriations are contained in Acts other than the annual Appropriation Acts. Special appropriations account for around three quarters of all Government expenditure each year. An example of payments made using a special appropriation would be aged pensions that are appropriated for in the *Social Security (Administration) Act 1999*.

A special appropriation is included in a specific Act when it is desired to provide a payment where an entitlement exists, or a payment of a specified amount separately identified from an annual Appropriation Act. Some special appropriations state a maximum amount that is appropriated for the particular purpose. They can be referred to as being ‘limited by amount’. Others do not state a maximum amount but the payment amount has to be calculated according to legislative criteria that will determine the amount to be paid.

A number of factors are taken into account in determining whether an annual or special appropriation is to be used in particular circumstances. For example, a cash limited appropriation might not be viable for an entitlement-based program which is demand driven.

Table 1.2 shows estimates of expenses for each active special appropriation Act for each agency. It is in two parts: the first is a summary table showing the total special appropriations by portfolio; the second shows the estimate for each special appropriation Act for each agency for the Budget year and an ‘Estimated Actual’ figure for the previous year. Amounts in the table are shown under the agencies whose Ministers are responsible for the special appropriation legislation concerned.

1.3 Estimated Cash Flows and Balances for Special Accounts

Some special appropriations take the form of a special account. A special account is an appropriation mechanism that sets aside an amount within the CRF for specific expenditure purposes. Special accounts are a method of delivering programmes that are resourced with contributions from another party such as other governments, contributions from industry or members of the community. In certain instances, a special account may be credited with amounts from annual appropriations, special appropriations or investment income.

Table 1.3 lists estimates for all Special Accounts, for the budget year and previous year. The table shows, by portfolio and agency, estimated balances and flows for each Special Account. Special Accounts marked with an * were abolished in the previous year.

There is an important distinction in the way receipts into Special Accounts are displayed in Table 1.3, Estimated Cash Flows and Balances for Special Accounts, and in Table 1.1, Agency Resourcing. The former distinguishes between appropriated and non-appropriated receipts into Special Accounts, while the Agency Resourcing Table shows only estimates of non-appropriated receipts to avoid double-counting in relation to receipts provided by other appropriated sources. Table 1.1 and 1.3 both include estimates of public money that is not held on account of the Commonwealth or for the use or benefit of the Commonwealth.

In relation to specific Special Accounts announced at this Budget, the Government will establish an Asset Recycling Fund (ARF) from 1 July 2014 and a Medical Research Future Fund (MRFF) from 1 January 2015. Funding for the ARF will include uncommitted amounts from the Building Australia Fund (BAF) and the Education Investment Fund (EIF). Funding for the MRFF will include uncommitted amounts from the Health and Hospitals Fund (HHF). The BAF, the EIF and the HHF will be closed on 31 December 2014. Remaining amounts will be reappropriated to meet the residual commitments of the funds. Further details of these arrangements, including changes to special accounts, will be reflected in future legislation, appropriation bills and related documentation.

Part 2: Staffing of Agencies

A SMALLER PUBLIC SERVICE AND SMALLER GOVERNMENT

The Government is committed to building a more sustainable public service that delivers better value for money for taxpayers.

It is anticipated that by 2016-17, the Australian Public Service will reduce by 16,500 ASL from 2013-14 levels. Some 14,500 of these reductions are the result of decisions in the 2013-14 Budget, in the 2013 Economic Statement and as a result of preceding decisions and policy settings. Around 2,000 are the result of decisions taken in the 2014-15 Budget.

Decisions taken in the 2014-15 Budget, which impact staffing are primarily the result of deliberate decisions about functions, priorities and the proper scope of government.

Many of the reductions in staffing levels are related to the Smaller Government budget measures, which achieve savings as a result of ceasing the operations of particular government bodies and merging others to reduce duplication, improve coordination and increase efficiency in how public funds are used to deliver services to the community.

The largest reduction to public service jobs over the forward estimates is in the Australian Taxation Office. The Government has brought forward reductions previously planned for 2015-16 by one year, which will assist with the broader effort to repair the Budget.

Other reductions in staffing levels in the Budget are the result of efficiencies in the back-office operations of government. For example, overlap in corporate areas is removed and staffing efficiencies achieved in this Budget as a result of consolidating AusAID into the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade and consolidating the key parts of the Department of Regional Australia, Local Government, the Arts and Sport into the Department of Infrastructure and Regional Development.

Some of the reductions in staffing levels are offset by temporary short term increases in particular areas to manage the early implementation of particular policy priorities.

In the Department of Immigration and Border Protection for example, there is a particular need to better manage the legacy of Illegal Maritime Arrivals in Australia inherited from the previous Government. Also, through the Department of Human Services, the Government is undertaking major structural reforms, including requiring young people with a capacity to work to earn, learn or Work for the Dole.

The Government has also adopted measures to better manage the 14,500 reduction in staffing levels as a result of decisions taken by the previous Government in 2013. Specifically, the Government has put in place a more methodical framework and

provided funding for required redundancy payments to ensure that the day-to-day operations of government agencies are not compromised.

Interim recruitment arrangements the Government announced on 31 October 2013 are still continuing as a way of achieving the forecast reductions and ensuring that the size of the public service is managed based on deliberate whole-of-government choices about priorities.

As part of the *Smaller Government Agenda*, the Government will continue to identify additional areas where appropriate reductions in the number of government bodies and related staffing levels can be achieved.

TRENDS IN AVERAGE STAFFING LEVELS

Trends in the estimated annual ASL for all agencies in the general government sector are reported in Table 2.1 below. The data provides a summary of people employed by the Australian Government, including all Defence Force personnel and those employed by statutory authorities. ASL figures reflect the average number of employees receiving salary or wages over the financial year, with adjustments for casual and part-time staff, to show the average full time equivalent.

The ASL for 2013-14, excluding military personnel and reserves, as reported in the 2013-14 Budget papers (Budget Paper 1) was 178,691. The current estimate for 2013-14 is 177,258 ASL in 2013-14. The ASL estimated for 2014-15 is 169,922, which is 7,336 lower than 2013-14 as shown in Table 2.1 and 8,769 lower than the projected 2013-14 ASL as at the 2013-14 Budget.

The Budget forecasts for the 2014-15 year will see total staffing in the general government sector return to the level last recorded in 2007-08. Excluding military personnel and reserves, levels will return to the more efficient and effective levels last recorded in 2006-07.

MACHINERY OF GOVERNMENT CHANGES AND AVERAGE STAFFING LEVELS

Following the issuing of Administrative Arrangements Orders on 18 September 2013, there were a number of Machinery of Government changes including transfers of functions between agencies, movements of agencies between portfolios, mergers of agencies, and the establishment and abolition of agencies. Comparison of ASL at portfolio and agency level between years should take into consideration that the related ASL would have a part-year effect in 2013-14 and a full-year effect in 2014-15.

Part 2: Staffing of agencies

- (f) Core ongoing ASL will decrease by 29, from 1,261 to 1,232 in 2014-15. - (x) The projected decrease includes the impact of the Machinery of Government changes of 18 September 2013. Staff transferred to the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet.
- (y) The higher ASL in 2013-14 is due to the use of irregular and intermittent APS staff to meet the workload of the 2013 Federal Election.
- (z) The projected decrease includes the impact of Machinery of Government changes of 18 September 2013 resulting in the integration of the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade and AusAID. Staff also transferred from the Department of Industry. The ASL numbers include locally engaged staff at posts of 2,296 in 2013-14 and 2,256 in 2014-15. The projected decrease is the result of Budget measures and other efficiency measures.
- (aa) AusAID functions and staff were transferred to the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade following the Machinery of Government changes of 18 September 2013. The ASL for the period that the agency was in operation is included in the ASL figures of the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade. After this date the ASL impact is included in the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade. Refer to note (z).
- (ab) The projected decrease includes the impact of Machinery of Government changes of 18 September 2013. Staff transferred from the Department of Resources, Energy and Tourism.
- (ac) The projected decrease includes the impact of Machinery of Government changes of 18 September 2013. Staff transferred from the Department of Regional Australia, Local Government, Arts and Sport; and to the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet and the Department of Social Services.
- (ad) The projected increase reflects additional staff to develop and implement four major project streams within the Commonwealth Program area.
- (ae) The agency will cease as an entity as at 30 June 2014. More information can be found in the Budget Measure: Smaller Government – Australian National Preventive Health Agency.

Part 2: Staffing of agencies

- (af) The projected decrease reflects alignment of staffing to operate within the allocated budget following implementation of efficiency measures.
More information can be found in the Budget Measure: Australian Sports Commission.
 - (ag) The agency will cease as an entity as at 1 January 2015. More information can be found in the Budget Measure: Rebuilding General Practice Education and Training to Deliver more General Practitioners.
 - (ah) The agency will cease as an entity as at 1 July 2014. More information can be found in the Budget Measure: Smaller Government – More Efficient Health Workforce Development.
 - (ai) The projected decrease includes the impact of Machinery of Government changes of 18 September 2013. Staff transferred to the Department of Industry and the Department of Social Services. The projected decrease also reflects the decline in the number of Illegal Maritime Arrivals (IMA) reducing the level of staffing required to support IMA onshore and offshore management and the alignment of staffing to operate within the allocated budget.
 - (aj) The projected decrease includes the impact of Machinery of Government changes of 18 September 2013. Staff transferred to the Department of Industry.
 - (ak) The functions and the staff were transferred to the Department of Industry following the Machinery of Government changes of 18 September 2013. The ASL for the period that the agency was in operation is included in the ASL figures of the Department of Industry. See also note (al).
 - (al) The projected decrease includes the impact of Machinery of Government changes of 18 September 2013. Staff transferred to the Department of Education, the Department of Social Services, the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet, the Department of the Treasury, the Department of the Environment, the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade, Austrade and the Department of Communications; and from the Department of Immigration and Border Protection, the former Department of Resources, Energy and Tourism and Customs.
 - (am) The agency will cease to exist as an entity when the relevant legislation is repealed. No ASL is therefore recorded in 2014-15 and the legacy functions will transfer into the Department of Industry.
 - (an) The projected decrease reflects alignment of staffing to operate within the allocated budget following implementation of efficiency measures and declining external revenue projections.
 - (ao) The Department of Regional Australia, Local Government, Arts and Sport (DRALGAS) ceased to exist following Machinery of Government changes of 18 September 2013. The ASL in 2013-14 is an estimate for the time DRALGAS was in operation. The ASL for the remainder of the year and the full year impact for 2014-15 are included in the figures for the Department of Infrastructure and Regional Development, Department of Health, Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet and the Attorney-General's Department.
 - (ap) The projected increase includes the impact of staff that transferred from the former Department of Regional Australia, Local Government, Arts and Sport following Machinery of Government changes of 18 September 2013.
 - (aq) A number of functions moved into the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet following the Machinery of Government changes of 18 September 2013. Staff transferred from the Attorney-General's Department, Department of Finance, Department of Communications, the former Department of Education, Employment, and Workplace Relations, Department of the Environment, Department of Health, Department of Industry, Department of Social Services, the former Department of Regional Australia, Local Government, Arts and Sports; and to the Department of Social Services.

- (ar) The projected decrease is a result of the extensive review of activities undertaken by the Council.
- (as) The projected increase represents the impact of new measures announced in the 2014-15 Budget.

Staff transferred from the Department of Health, the Department of Employment, the Department of Immigration and Border Protection, the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet, and to the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet. The projected decrease reflects the alignment of staffing to operate within the allocated budget following implementation of efficiency measures which is partly offset by the impact of new measures announced in the 2014-15 Budget.

PART 3: EXPENSES AND NET CAPITAL INVESTMENT

This part reports on Departmental Expenses and Net Capital Investment, by agency. The data are presented on the same basis as data in Statement 6 of Budget Paper No. 1. Both sets of data are presented on the basis of external accounting and financial reporting standards. These standards present information in terms of accrued expenses and accrued revenue.

The main external standards used are:

- the Australian Bureau of Statistics' (ABS) accrual Government Finance Statistics (GFS) publication, Australian System of Government Finance Statistics: Concepts, Sources and Methods, (cat no. 5514.0), which in turn is based on the International Monetary Fund (IMF) accrual GFS framework; and
- Australian Accounting Standards (AAS), being AASB 1049 Whole of Government and General Government Sector Financial Reporting (AASB 1049) and other applicable Australian Equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (AEIFRS).

The reports differ from the reports in Part 1, where data is presented on estimates of available cash appropriations. On an accrual basis, revenue from previous years can be carried over for agency expenses in a future year. Additionally, some accrued expenses are not appropriated for, such as asset writedowns, foreign exchanges losses, fair value losses and depreciation.

The tables in this Part are affected by Machinery of Government changes. For example, where an agency was abolished it will have estimated expenses in 2013-14 reflecting expenditure in part of that year, and not subsequently. Where an agency has been created as a result of the changes estimates are displayed in both 2013-14 and 2014-15, and projected out-years.

Part 3: Expenses and Net Capital Investment

3.1 DEPARTMENTAL EXPENSES BY AGENCY

Table 3.1 presents departmental expenses by agency. Departmental expenses reduce the net worth of agencies. It includes expenses such as payment of wages and purchases of goods and services. It excludes administered expenses paid on behalf of government such as social benefits and grants to the States. It also excludes capital expenditure which does not reduce net worth.
