I understand that you have already received a communication from your district welfare officer in Broome, Mr Cadineaux, informing you of Bishop Jobst's refusal to allow me to visit missions in this area.

Following a personal interview which I had with the Bishop in Broome last Friday evening I am glad to be able to assure you that I now have his approval to visit Lombadina, where I arrived last night, and Beagle Bay. He tells me that it will not be convenient for me to visit Balgo Mission.

During my talk with the Bishop I was able to explain more fully the purpose of visits and to emphasise the pleasure which /II ways appear to receive when listening to a playback of my recordings of their own music. At the same time I felt it necessary to stress that I had neither the time nor the inclination to associate myself with the actions of a student minority at Monash University which have recently/so much publicity.

Thank you for the Reserve Entry Fermit (DNW 252/68) which reached me in Broome .
