What is CAMRA?

CAMRA, the Campaign for Real Ale is an independent, voluntary organisation campaigning for real ale, community pubs and consumer rights.

CAMRA was formed back in March 1971, by a small group of beer lovers who were disillusioned with the domination of the UK beer market by a handful of companies selling a small range of ales, often of low flavour and overall quality. Over the years since, CAMRA has grown massively, now having over 160,000 members across the world, and has been described as the most successful consumer campaign in Europe. Since CAMRA was founded, the number of breweries operating in the UK has grown to more than 1,000. Without CAMRA's presence, it is unlikely this would have happened and real ale would not be as widespread and popular as it is today.

CAMRA supports well-run pubs as the centres of community life – whether in rural or urban areas – and believes their continued existence play a critical social role in UK culture. CAMRA also supports the pub as the one place in which to consume real ale and to try one of over 5,500 different styles now produced. Cask beer in a pub is a British institution – no other country serves more real ale on draught than we do!

At local level, CAMRA's Leicester branch has over 1,800 members and organises events to promote real ale, including regular social activities, day trips, brewery visits etc, as well as producing our popular Leicester Drinker magazine. Our "LocAle" scheme encourages pubs to, where possible, stock at least one beer from a local brewery. This helps to reduce "beer miles", boosts the local economy and creates an increased sense of local identity and pride – let's celebrate what makes our region different! The highlight of the year is the Leicester Beer Festival where we showcase some 250 beers and ciders, many from breweries within 25 miles of the city.
