

In 2011 Pope Benedict published "Porta Fidei" announcing the Year of Faith which began in October 2012. Our Lord's disciples asked "What must we do, to be doing the works of God?" (Jn 6:28). Pope Benedict reminds us that Christians are called to radiate the word of truth that the Lord Jesus has left us.

"By faith, across the centuries, men and women of all ages,have confessed the beauty of following the Lord Jesus wherever they were called to bear witness to the fact that they were Christian: in the family, in the workplace, in public life, in the exercise of the charisms and ministries to which they were called."

Through faith, we can recognize the face of the risen Lord in those who ask for our love. "As you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me" (Mt 25:40).

Pope Benedict asks us both to deepen our faith but also to live our faith at home and in the workplace. This conference will therefore explore difficult answers to difficult questions as well as looking at some other areas in which faith enables us to see that which others might not. We shall look at medical aspects of miracles as well as some specifically Catholic services and supports for the sick and for those in trouble.

As Pope Benedict says "Let us entrust this time of grace to the Mother of God, proclaimed "blessed because she believed" (Lk 1:45)."
