

What has Changed?

- Significant westward shift of storm track.
- Upgrade to Blizzard Warning for NY/NJ Metro and most points N & W.
- Winter Storm Warning for E LI/SE CT due to uncertainties in duration of heavy snow before changeover to sleet/rain.

Heavy Snow	 1-2' NY/NJ Metro and points N&W 8-14" Coastlowest E LI/SE CT Tue AM Snowfall rates of 2- 4"/hr Tue AM Whiteout conditions likely. 	Late Tonight and Tuesday
Wind	 35 to 50 mphhighest along coast Gusts to 60 mph across E LI/SE CT Potential for power outages 	Tuesday Morning into Afternoon
Coastal Flooding	Widespread minor to moderate impacts	The high tide cycles Tuesday morning into early afternoon
Marine	 Wind gusts of 45-55+ KT Seas 15'-20' on the ocean and 4 to 8' on the Sound 	Tuesday

Dangerous Travel Conditions for Tue Am commute! Whiteout Conditions with several roads likely impassable!










Most Likely Snow Forecast



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








Weather Prediction Center Forecast Map: 8 a.m. Tuesday











Forecast Uncertainties

Significant Westward Shift of Storm Track

- Location and Duration of Heavy Snow Bands
 - Highest likelihood/duration for NY/NJ metro / Lower Hudson Valley and SW CT.
- Western extent of changeover to Sleet and or Rain (25-50 mile westward shift)
 - Highest likelihood for transition across E LI / SE CT late Tue am/ Tue Aft
- Western extent of strong to damaging wind gusts (25-50 mile westward shift)
 - Highest likelihood for 60+ mph wind gusts across E LI / SE CT
- Magnitude of Coastal Flooding
 - Minor to moderate coastal impacts expected
 - Increasing probability of moderate coastal impacts with Tue am/aft high tide for southern and eastern bay areas of LI

Heavy Snow Expected Tonight into Tuesday AM

Damaging Wind gusts likely for E LI and SE CT

Blizzard Conditions Expected for NY/NJ Metro and most points to the N & W

Minor to Moderate Coastal Impacts

Period of Greatest Impact:
