

1	CERTIFICATE I	Gain the knowledge and skills to begin initial work and/or undertake further learning.
2	CERTIFICATE II	Acquire the knowledge and skills for work in a defined context and/or undertake further learning.
3	CERTIFICATE III (apprenticeship)	Apprenticeship training provides practical hands- on experience completed with employers, and develops theoretical knowledge. Gain deeper theoretical and practical knowledge and skills for your work and/or prepare to undertake further learning.







"I was born in Burundi but fled in 2010 because of political unrest and the murder of both my parents. I was also poisoned and looked after by the United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR) in Kenya until I was given a second chance at life by the Australian Government.

I chose to study here because of the good facilities and services offered to immigrants and students from low income families. All of my achievements are because of the support I received during my study – the teachers listened to me and transformed me into a better person who can serve other people, especially those who seek refuge in other countries.

I have recently completed an internship with the African Population and Health Research Center (APHRC), winner of the 2015 United Nations Population award, helping to empower talented refugees. In 2016 this amounts to \$204 for fulltime government-funded students, \$102 for part-time government-funded students, \$42 for students studying off campus and \$84 for concession card holders. Students studying less than 25 hours are exempt from the fee.

VET FEE-HELP

VET FEE-HELP is available to assist eligible students studying higher-level vocational education and training (VET) qualifications to pay their tuition fees. Higher-level VET qualifications are at the diploma level and above. VET FEE-HELP can be used to pay all or part of an eligible student's tuition fees, but cannot be used for additional study costs such as accommodation or text books.



MORE AFFORDABLE TAFE STUDY

As a Victorian TAFE provider we are able to offer exemptions from the limits on government funding for your study in 2016.

What does this mean for you?

Even if you already have a qualification for which you have previously received government funding, you may still be eligible for a governmentsupported place in 2016. In addition, you can receive funded training for courses at a lower level or in a different field to your current qualification. For example, you can gain a government-funded place for a TAFE course, even if you have already completed a bachelor or masters degree.

HOW TO APPLY



There are two main ways to apply for courses at Victoria Polytechnic: apply directly to us or, for some programs, apply through the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC).

Most courses commence from late January to early March. Some of our courses also have a mid-year intake, and a number of our courses accept applications throughout the year.

Application procedures depend on your student status, the course, and the type of place you wish to apply for.

Check the course page online for the correct way to apply and the closing date for applications. Dates may change if a course is full or still accepting applications.

If you are a current Year 12 student applying for a course that is available via VTAC, you must apply through VTAC.

Our courses available via VTAC include fulltime Certificate IV, diploma and advanced diploma courses.

APPRENTICESHIP AND TRAINEESHIP APPLICANTS

The application process differs if you would like to complete an apprenticeship or traineeship through Victoria Polytechnic.

To apply for an apprenticeship or traineeship, follow these steps:

1

Find an employer in your chosen trade who will employ you as an apprentice or trainee. Employers often prefer to take on apprentices with pre-apprenticeship qualifications which you can undertake through Victoria Polytechnic.

2

Your employer will then need to contact an Australian Apprenticeship Centre and sign a training contract to register you as an apprentice.

3

Nominate Victoria Polytechnic as your preferred registered training organisation (RTO).

Within six to eight weeks after successfully completing this process, your classroom training will commence.
