The purpose of this letter is to inform you of a proposed gift of audio recordings, from the Australian Institute of Aboriginal Studies to the Institute of Papua New Guinea Studies, and of the fact that your name, as the first collector some of the material in the package will be duly acknowledged in the accompanying document.
