The Warden at USP Marion has submitted a recommendation to redesignate inmate McGowan from the Communications Management Unit program.

The CTU **does not** concur with this recommendation, and requests inmate McGowan remain in the CMU program at this time.



Inmate McGowan was recommended and approved for placement in a CMU due to his association with the Earth Liberation Front (ELF) and Animal Liberation Front (ALF), groups considered domestic terrorist organizations. Inmate McGowan, along with his group of co-defendants, committed numerous acts of arson, destruction of an energy facility, attempted arson, use of explosives and incendiary devices, interference with interstate commerce, sabotage, intimidation, and other acts of property destruction. Inmate McGowan plead guilty to 5 counts which included Conspiracy to Commit Arson; Destruction of Energy Facility & Arson / Attempted Arson.

Inmate McGowan's communications warranted heightened controls and review due to the fact that he was an organizer of the group; wrote communiques for ALF/ELF actions; used coded communications during the commission of the offenses; participated in recruitment of others into the group; espoused his anti-government beliefs verbally and in written communications; trained others to design and construct incendiary devices and well as how to conduct arson without being caught; and demonstrated the ability to plan, organize and carry out his plans without detection.

Through his communications, inmate McGowan continues to provide guidance, leadership and direction for activities, publications and movement practices in order to further the goals of radical environmental groups. Inmate McGowan receives an enormous amount of communication material each month, through social mail, e-mail, phone calls and visiting. A number of these communications have been recommended and approved for rejection based on advocating criminal activity.



Inmate McGowan is a LOW security inmate with IN custody. He is a Care Level 1 inmate.

If approved despite the objections of the CTU, is it recommended inmate McGowan be re-designated to USP Marion GP for no less than 6 months, as a step-down process from the CMU, as outlined in current CMU procedures.

CORRECTIONAL PROGRAMS: MCGOWAN was transferred to MAR CMU on August 22, 2008. He was approved for transfer to CMU based on his association with the Earth Liberation Front (ELF) and the Animal Liberation Front (ALF). Both are considered domestic terrorist organizations. MCGOWAN's instant offense involved acts of arson, destruction of an energy facility, attempted arson, use of explosives and incendiary devices, interference with interstate commerce, sabotage, intimidation, and other acts of property destruction. He was sentenced to a term of 84 months for Conspiracy to Commit Arson and Destruction of Energy Facility, Arson, and Attempted Arson. He has a projected release date of June 5, 2013, via GCT. MCGOWAN was considered the leader/organizer of the groups, ALF/ELF, and used coded communications during the commission of the offenses, participated in recruitment, espoused his anti-government beliefs, trained others to design and construct incendiary devices for arson and demonstrated the ability to plan, organize and carry out his plans without detection. CTU indicates, although marginalized, MCGOWAN continues to correspond with numerous associates of these groups [REDACTED] as well as criminal charges. He continues to provide guidance, leadership and direction for activities, publications and movement practices in order to further the goals of the group. He has had correspondence rejected based on advocating criminal activity. USP MAR has recommended MCGOWAN be transferred out of the CMU program due to his clear conduct, positive relationship with staff, educational programming. They acknowledge his rejected correspondence, but indicate it does not relate to his crimes for which he is presently incarcerated. CTU does not concur with the recommendation. P. Pottios

CORRECTIONAL PROGRAMS ADMINISTRATOR: Based on information provided by CTU, I do not concur with the recommendation to transfer out of CMU requested

PSYCHOLOGY SERVICES ADMINISTRATOR: No issues noted which impact consideration for CMU re-entry. IM has been in the CMU for 2 years. No issues noted by him but he is considered to be actively coming as evidenced by the rejected correspondence. IM has been involved with DAR staff. Recommend he remain in an additional year to further monitor his association with outside groups.

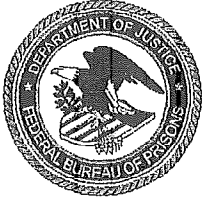

**NOTICE:** You are advised that prior to filing a Request for Administrative Remedy (BP-9), you **MUST** attempt to informally resolve your complaint through your counselor. Please follow the three (3) steps listed below.

1. State your specific complaint: I was denied transfer out of the CMU after 20 months of clear conduct, participation in classes and no problems with my communication (mail, phone, email). The letter dated 4/9/10 denying me does not state a reason for denial of transfer. Finally, I have not received a hearing where I can contest the rationale for keeping me in the CMU.

2. State what efforts you have made to informally resolve your complaint: I have discussed this issue with the warden (Ms. Hollingsworth), Mr. Kelly and Mr. Keumann + Mr. Rivas.

3. State what resolution you request: I would like to receive a reason for my continued placement at the CMU. I am requesting a hearing in which I can prepare a defense and contest the dubious claims relied on to keep me in the CMU or 300 phone minutes a month and visiting hours and conditions (contact visits) consistent with a general population unit.

Additionally, you request a due process hearing so you may contest the reasons for your placement in the CMU, and you request your allotted monthly phone time be raised to 300 minutes.


According to our records, you were transferred to the CMU at the United States Penitentiary in Marion, Illinois, on August 22, 2008, based on your current offense behavior or your continued behavior while incarcerated. Your transfer to the CMU allows greater management of your communication with persons in the community through more effective monitoring of your telephone use, written correspondence, and visiting. Your communication by these methods may be limited as necessary to allow effective monitoring; therefore, you will remain at your current level of 30 phone minutes per week.

The CMU is not a special housing unit or a control unit; therefore, there is no requirement to afford a due process hearing prior to or during placement.

Your transfer to this unit was approved by the Correctional Programs Division, Central Office, Federal Bureau of Prisons. Your continued housing in this unit will be reviewed during each program review conducted by your unit team.

Accordingly, your Request for Administrative Remedy is denied. In the event you are not satisfied with this response and wish to appeal, you may do so within 20 calendar days of this response by submitting a BP-230(13) to the Regional Director, Federal Bureau of Prisons, North Central Regional Office, Gateway Complex, Tower II, 8th Floor, 400 State Avenue, Kansas City, Kansas 66101-2492.

Part A - REASON FOR APPEAL This is an appeal of my BP-9 re: the denial of my transfer request on April 9, 2010 by Warden Hollingsworth. I have been at the CMU for 20 months with neither disciplinary violations nor problems with my communication with the outside world (i.e. phone, visits, email or mail). The memo regarding my denial does not state why I was rejected and the Warden's response only repeats the vague reason given to me when I arrived. Without any reason stated for continued placement here in the CMU, how can I change whatever behavior the BoP is alleging I am partaking in? I am requesting either:

- 1) A transfer to a normal prison without communication restrictions or
- 2) A specific reason for why I am being kept here at the CMU with
- 3) a hearing so that I may contest these claims and have that reflected on the record for future legal suits. (or)
- 4) A restoration of communication privileges to full status i.e. 300 phone minutes/month and contact visits.

My continued placement here is a violation of my due process rights under the US constitution. I kindly request that you review my transfer request and process it so that I may serve out my remaining 36 months at a prison where I can get contact visits and work toward release.

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This is in response to your Regional Administrative Remedy Appeal received in this office on May 6, 2010, in which you appeal the decision to deny your request for transfer from the Communication Management Unit (CMU). For relief, you request a transfer out of the CMU, a due process hearing and a full restoration of your telephone and visiting privileges.

We have reviewed your appeal and the Warden's response dated April 25, 2010. The Bureau of Prisons has the authority to make designation assignments deemed appropriate and necessary to ensure the safe and orderly operation of its facilities and the protection of the public. You were designated to the CMU to ensure additional monitoring of your communication could be accomplished. This may be the result of current offense behavior or other verified information. Those inmates who require heightened monitoring will continue to be designated to the CMU. A recent review of your status determined you still require the security and supervision afforded by the CMU and you are deemed to be appropriately classified at this time. As stated in the Warden's response, your status in the CMU will continue to be reviewed. As documented, increased telephone monitoring and non-contact visiting were implemented in order to ensure the safe and orderly operation of the facility, as well as, the protection of members of the public. Your calls will continue to receive increased monitoring, and you will receive 30 telephone minutes per week. Additionally, a due process hearing is not required.

Based on the above, this response to your Regional Administrative Remedy Appeal is denied.

If you are dissatisfied with this response, you may appeal to the Office of General Counsel, Federal Bureau of Prisons, 320 First Street, NW, Washington, DC 20534. Your appeal must be received in the Office of General Counsel within 30 days from the date of this response.

The Bp10 response fails in describing why exactly I am still being held at the CMU. I am requesting that your office overturn the Regional Office's decision and:

- 1) Transfer me to a prison suitable for my security level and restore my full communication privileges.
- 2) Document for me specifically why I am continuing to be held here at the CMU

Inmate McGowan arrived at the Communications Management Unit (CMU), Marion, Illinois, on August 22, 2008. He was placed in the CMU based on his current offense of conviction and he has been identified as a member and leader in the Earth Liberation Front (ELF) and the Animal Liberation Front (ALF), groups considered to be domestic terrorist organizations. His offense conduct included communicating in code and teaching others how to commit crimes of arson.

Since his arrival he has maintained clear conduct and a good rapport with staff and other inmates. He has completed ten ACE/Education courses, is currently enrolled in one other, and has completed a paralegal studies course from Blackstone Career Services. While he has had several incoming publications and letters rejected based on content, USP Marion staff have noted no continuation of actions which precipitated his placement in the CMU.



Inmate McGowan is eligible for transfer according to the Bureau's policy on Classification and Program Review of Inmates. Therefore, the unit team is requesting inmate McGowan be considered for transfer to any facility which can provide for his security and custody needs.

Warden's Comments: While continued monitoring will be necessary, I believe it can be completed in an open GA setting.

The Warden at USP Marion has submitted a recommendation to redesignate inmate McGowan from the Communications Management Unit program.

The CTU **does not** concur with this recommendation, and recommends inmate McGowan remain in the CMU program at this time.

Inmate McGowan was recommended and approved for placement in a CMU due to his association with the Earth Liberation Front (ELF) and Animal Liberation Front (ALF), groups considered domestic terrorist organizations. Inmate McGowan, along with his group of co-defendants, committed numerous acts of arson, destruction of an energy facility, attempted arson, use of explosives and incendiary devices, interference with interstate commerce, sabotage, intimidation, and other acts of property destruction. Inmate McGowan plead guilty to 5 counts which included Conspiracy to Commit Arson; Destruction of Energy Facility & Arson / Attempted Arson.

Inmate McGowan's communications warranted heightened controls and review due to the fact that he was an organizer of the group; wrote communiques for ALF/ELF actions; used coded communications during the commission of the offenses; participated in recruitment of others into the group; espoused his anti-government beliefs verbally and in written communications; trained others to design and construct incendiary devices and well as how to conduct arson without being caught; and demonstrated the ability to plan, organize and carry out his plans without detection.

**1. Rationale for Re-designation:**

Inmate McGowan was originally designated to a Communications Management Unit and placed in MAR CMU on August 22, 2008. He was approved for step-down from the CMU program and released to MAR GP on October 19, 2010.

During his six month step-down from the CMU program, on January 30, 2011, inmate McGowan directed his wife, Jenny Synan, to circumvent inmate communication monitoring by having documents mailed to the institution under the guise of attorney-client privileged communication (special/legal mail). Specifically, during a telephone conversation, inmate McGowan and his wife discussed the unauthorized release of Counter Terrorism Unit reports to the public through the web site, [REDACTED]. These reports, which contained the label, "Unclassified // For Official Use Only / Law Enforcement Sensitive," were obtained without the approval of the Bureau of Prisons, contained law enforcement information relating to intelligence gathering and investigations, and were released to the public without authorization. The release of these documents, as well as documents contained on the web site from a large number of government military, law enforcement and intelligence agencies, remains under investigation by the Attorney General and Department of Justice for possible criminal prosecution.

Though Synan indicated she knew of the reports and had made inmate McGowan's attorney's aware as well, she specifically stated she was reluctant to mail copies of the

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documents to the institution. Inmate McGowan, understanding the web site leaked restricted government reports, and aware of Bureau of Prisons policies regarding inmate communications, specifically and directly instructed his wife to facilitate the attempted introduction of these documents into the institution by circumventing monitoring through the use of legal mail from an identified attorney. Inmate McGowan stated he wanted to evaluate the original reports for himself, regardless of his wife's concerns with mailing copies to the institution, and in addition to any review conducted by his attorneys.

The attorney, identified as Rachel in the telephone conversation, has been identified as Rachael Meerpool, Attorney, from the Center for Constitutional Rights.

Further, inmate McGowan's communication with persons in the community since his release from MAR CMU has continued to demonstrate his support for anarchist and radical environmental terrorist groups, and presented his desire to remain in an influential and leadership position among these groups.

A review of inmates is conducted regularly in order to determine whether continued CMU placement is necessary and whether the original reasons for CMU placement still exist. Inmates approved for transfer from a CMU are re-designated to a typical general population for a period of no less than 6 months, as a step-down process from the CMU.

Prior to the completion of his 6 months step-down from the CMU, inmate McGowan has demonstrated the conditions for his original designation still exist through his espousing support for anarchist and radical environmental terrorist groups. Further, inmate McGowan explicitly, and with knowledge and understanding, attempted to violate Bureau policies in order to circumvent communication monitoring in order to receive correspondence which he was aware was prohibited. Through specific action, inmate McGowan attempted to facilitate the circumvention of attorney-client privileged communication in order to receive non-legal correspondence and with the knowledge such correspondence would violate prison regulations.

Inmate McGowan's actions and behavior indicate the original rationale for CMU designation has not been mitigated, and that he continues to present a risk which requires the degree of monitoring and controls afforded at a CMU. His attempt to violate policy and circumvent communication monitoring, as well as attorney-client privileged communication, represents a program failure of the 6 month step-down from the CMU. Based on this information, it is recommended inmate McGowan be re-designated to a CMU

Inmate McGowan's offense conducted included membership in a group which was called, "The Family." This collection of approximately 16 persons are associated with the Earth Liberation Front (ELF) and Animal Liberation Front (ALF), groups considered by law enforcement agencies to be domestic terrorist organizations. Below are excerpts from the conversation.

McGowan: They told me today about the probublica thing from a few weeks ago.

Synan: I'm sorry, what?

McGowan: Propublica, that leak website where there was like these

documents posted and my name came up.

Synan: Oh yea, yea, yea.

McGowan: That's the kind of stuff I really want to hear about.

Synan: I'm sorry, your lawyer Rachael knows about it. I'm reluctant to send it. I make sure that you lawyers know about it.

McGowan: Can you ask her to send it to me.

Synan: Yea, yea.

McGowan: That was really creepy.

Synan: Yea but there is nothing new, of course it's creepy.

McGowan: I know but I just wanted to see it and evaluate it for myself, you know that's crazy.


