U.S.-Colombia FTA will Support Jobs and Increase Exports for Companies and Farmers in Colorado

During the August recess, Colombian Ambassador to the U.S. Gabriel Silva traveled across the United States, including Colorado, to meet with local businesses, farmers and workers to discuss the benefits of the pending U.S.-Colombia Free Trade Agreement (FTA).

The FTA Will Benefit Colorado Exporters By...

- Generating additional export opportunities. Colombia is **Colorado's 5th largest export market in Latin America**. In 2010, Colorado's exports to Colombia totaled **\$20 million**.
- Increasing Colorado's key exports to Colombia. The U.S. International Trade Commission estimates that with the FTA, U.S. exports in sectors that are important to Colorado will increase substantially, including:
 - Manufactured goods 60 percent increase
 - Beef products 46 percent increase
 - o Processed foods **36 percent increase**
 - o Chemicals 23 percent increase
- Phasing out tariffs for all Colorado exports to Colombia over time. The FTA will immediately remove tariffs on more than 77 percent of Colorado's exports to Colombia giving local exporters an estimated \$1.1 million cost advantage over nations without a FTA with Colombia.
- Reducing or eliminating the \$1.5 million in tariffs that the top 45 Colorado-based companies unnecessarily paid last year.
