Excerpt: "The U.S. economy needs swift approval of the pending free-trade agreements with Colombia, Panama and South Korea....The longer the United States delays, the larger market share U.S. producers lose as global competitors fill the void. Take Colombia, a crucial market and a valuable ally in a strategically important region. While U.S. exporters continue to face high tariffs and declining market share, Argentina and Brazil are already taking the market from U.S. agricultural producers, and a Colombian free-trade deal with Canada will come online in barely a month.

"Both the administration and congressional Republicans profess an appropriate sense of urgency regarding passage of the trade agreements....[W]e must depend on our leaders to find common ground and, in this case, quickly resolve an impasse that threatens to undermine our engagement with the world economy. The reward would be the creation of new jobs and opportunities for workers and businesses across the country."
