Panitch and Gindin's monumental study offers a significant rethinking of the development of global capitalism. Transcending classical theories of interimperialist rivalry and the false dichotomy between states and markets in the neoliberal era, this book produces an exceptionally rich account of postwar global capitalism to the present day. Focussing on the American state, Panitch and Gindin argue that its distinctiveness rests in its capacity to identify the interests of its own capital with that of capital in general, while restructuring other states to the end of spreading capitalist social relations and preventing economic crises from interrupting capital's globalizing tendencies. Examining recent economic crises, the authors identify social conflict occurring within, rather than between, states, producing political fault-lines replete with possibilities for the emergence of new movements to transcend capitalist markets and states.

LEO PANITCH is Canada Research Chair in Comparative Political Economy in the Department of Political Science at York University, Toronto. Editor of the Socialist Register since 1985, his books include *Working Class Politics in Crisis; The End of Parliamentary Socialism;* and *Renewing Socialism: Transforming Democracy, Strategy and Imagination.*

SAM GINDIN is the former Research Director of the Canadian Autoworkers Union and Packer Visiting Chair in Social Justice at York University. Among his many publications, he is the author (with Greg Albo and Leo Panitch) of *In and Out of Crisis: The Global Financial Meltdown and Left Alternatives*.

Call it the year of dreaming dangerously: in 2011 we all witnessed (and participated in) a series of shattering events. Emancipatory dreams mobilized protesters in New York, Tahrir Square, London and Athens —and there were the obscure destructive dreams propelling the mass murderer Breivik and racist populists all around the world, from the Netherlands and Hungary to Arizona. The subterranean work of dissatisfaction is continuing: rage is accumulating and a new wave of revolts will follow. Why? Because the events of 2011 were signs from the future: we should analyze them as limited, distorted (sometimes even perverted) fragments of a utopian future which lies dormant in the present as its hidden potential.

SLAVOJ ŽIŽEK is a Slovenian philosopher and cultural critic. His books include *Less Than Nothing*; *Living in the End Times*; *First as Tragedy, Then as Farce*; *In Defense of Lost Causes*; six volumes of the Essential Žižek, and many more.







The past decade in the UK has seen the rise of the British National Party, the country's most successful ever far-right political movement, and the emergence of the anti-Islamic English Defence League. 

Building on his work as a leading member of the renowned Research on Money and Finance group, Costas Lapavitsas presents a searing critique of the neoliberal nature of the eurozone. He ruthlessly dissects the roots of the current financial turmoil and the European debt crisis. Lapavitsas argues that European austerity will lead to a longer, deeper recession, worsening the burden of debt and further imperilling banks and the monetary union itself. 



We are living in the great age of human migration. Some 200 million people alive today have moved from their countries of origin and, according to a recent international survey, as many as 700 million more would migrate if they could. The political reaction—in Europe no less than in the United States—has been to batten down the hatches. More than a million migrants have been expelled from the US during Barack Obama's administration, a record rate.



Alfredo Gutierrez's father, a US citizen, was deported to Mexico from his Arizona hometown—the mining town where Alfredo grew up. This occurred during a wave of anti-immigrant hysteria stoked by the Great Depression, but as Gutierrez makes clear, in a book that is at once a personal chronicle and a thought-provoking history, the war on Mexican immigrants has rarely abated. Barack Obama now presides over an immigration policy that is the equal of Herbert Hoover's in its harshness.


His family experiences inspired Gutierrez to pursue the life of a Chicano activist. Kicked out of Arizona State University after leading a takeover of the president's office, he later became the majority leader of the Arizona State Senate. Later still, he was a successful political consultant. He remains an activist, and in this engrossing memoir and essay, he both dissects the racism that has animated a century of border policy—including a record number of deportations under Obama—and the timidity of immigrant advocacy organizations today.

ALFREDO GUTIERREZ helped found the national Chicano student organization MEChA. He was elected to the Arizona State Senate at the age of twenty-five and served as both Majority and Minority Leader. After losing his bid for Governor of Arizona in '02, he began hosting a popular radio show and is also the editor of LaFronteraTimes.com.



In what might be called the "Now Is Not the Time" canard, each US presidential election becomes a moment of unique, life-or-death urgency that precludes reflection or dissent. The stakes are too high; the horrors that the Republicans could impose in four years of rule are too great. With no substantial political debates or movements between elections, the only option for progressives is to support the Democratic candidates—and there is little to no left-wing pressure on Obama to change his policies.

In *Obama Redux*, Adolph Reed bucks this trend to provide the first thorough analysis of this historical dynamic at work—from the extension of global neoliberalism and domestic repression under Clinton, to the role of corporate PR and the mass media in shaping our understanding and expectations of the political system. If Obama can spend a record-breaking election-year war chest while at the same time decrying the "corrosive effect of money in politics," then as we enter this election the Left needs to reflect more deeply on its history and the role of real political dissent.



Harking back to his mentor Louis Althusser, Badiou explains how politics conditions philosophy, while suggesting that philosophy itself may be needed to clarify the truths produced within the political condition. Badiou also offers an intriguing take on what he calls the four major "ensembles" of French and, more broadly, Western society today, in which new emancipatory forms of politics are emerging: students, the young, workers and immigrants. Badiou concludes with a return to the notion of communism, here defined as an answer to the obscure knot that ties politics, philosophy and democracy.

ALAIN BADIOU teaches philosophy at the École normale supérieure and the Collège international de philosophie in Paris. His recent books include *Ethics*; *Metapolitics*; *Polemics*; *The Communist Hypothesis*; *Five Lessons on Wagner*; and *Wittgenstein's Antiphilosophy*.



Most people assume that racism grows from a perception of human difference: the fact of race gives rise to the practice of racism. In this myth-busting reflection, the sociologist Karen E. Fields and the historian Barbara J. Fields argue the opposite: the practice of racism produces the illusion of race, through what they call "racecraft". And racecraft is intimately entwined with other forms of inequality in American life. So pervasive are the devices of racecraft in American history, economic doctrine, politics and everyday thinking that the presence of racecraft itself goes unnoticed.

That the promised post-racial age has not dawned, the Fieldses argue, reflects the failure of Americans to develop a legitimate language for thinking about and discussing inequality. That failure should worry all who care about democratic institutions.

BARBARA J. FIELDS is Professor of History at Columbia University. Her books include the prize-winning *Slavery and Freedom on the Middle Ground* and (co-authored with the Freedmen and Southern Society Project) *The Destruction of Slavery* and *Free At Last: A Documentary History of Slavery, Freedom, and the Civil War.*

KAREN E. FIELDS is Distinguished Visiting Scholar in the Center for African and African American Research at Duke University. Her books include a translation of Emile Durkheim's *The Elementary Forms of Religious Life*. She is at work on *Racism in the Academy: A Traveler's Guide* and *Bordeaux's Africa*.



Among the ranks of the ex-Leftists, most of whom are readily forgotten, Christopher Hitchens stands out as someone determined to do just that. Hu Feng, the "counterrevolutionary" leader of a banned literary school, spent twenty-five years in the Chinese Communist Party prison system. But back in the early days of Communist China he was among the party's chief literary theoreticians and critics—at least until factional infighting, and his short fuse, made him persona non grata among the establishment.

His wife, Mei Zhi, shared his incarceration for many years. *F* is her account of that time, beginning ten years after Hu Feng's initial arrest, as she navigates the party's Byzantine prison bureaucracy, searching for his whereabouts. Eventually imprisoned, she cares for her husband in his rage and suffering, watching his descent into madness as the excesses of the Cultural Revolution take their toll.

Both an intimate portrait of Mei Zhi's life with Hu Feng and a stark account of the prison system and life under Mao, F is at once beautiful and harrowing.

MEI ZHI was a writer and revolutionary and the wife of literary dissident Hu Feng. She died in 2004.



The book engages in a polemical critique of recent efforts to revive World Literature models of literary studies (Moretti, Casanova, etc.) on the grounds that they construct their curricula on an assumption of translatability. As a result, incommensurability and what Apter calls the "untranslatable" are insufficiently built into the literary heuristic. Drawing on philosophies of translation developed by de Man, Derrida, Sam Weber, Barbara Johnson, Abdelfattah Kilito and Édouard Glissant, as well as on the way in which "the untranslatable" is given substance in the context of Barbara Cassin's Vocabulaire européen des philosophies: Dictionnaire des intraduisibles, the aim is to activate Untranslatability as a theoretical fulcrum of Comparative Literature with bearing on approaches to world literature, literary world systems and literary history, the politics of periodization, the translation of philosophy and theory, the bounds of non-secular proscription and cultural sanction, free versus privatized authorial property, and the poetics of translational difference.


Lineages of the Absolutist State

PERRY ANDERSON

The political nature of Absolutism has long been a subject of controversy within historical materialism. Developing considerations advanced in *Passages from Antiquity to Feudalism*, this book situates the Absolutist states of the early modern epoch against the prior background of European feudalism. It is divided into two parts. The first discusses the overall structures of Absolutism as a state-system in Western Europe, from the Renaissance onwards. It then looks in turn at the trajectory of each of the specific Absolutist states in the dominant countries of the West—Spain, France, England and Sweden, set off against the case of Italy, where no major indigenous Absolutism developed.

The second part of the work sketches a comparative prospect of Absolutism in Eastern Europe. The peculiarities, as well as affinities, of Eastern Absolutism as a distinct type of royal state, are examined. The variegated monarchies of Prussia, Austria and Russia are surveyed, and the lessons asked of the counter-example of Poland. Finally, the structure of the Ottoman Empire in the Balkans is taken as an external gauge by which the singularity of Absolutism as a European phenomenon is assessed. The work ends with some observations on the special position occupied by European development within universal history, which draws themes from both *Passages from Antiquity to Feudalism* and *Lineages of the Absolutist State* together into a single argument—within their common limits—as materials for debate.
