
# Rusty Takes to the Aim (sans Galion).

LAND RIGHTS!

This week all the people of Maningrida have been talking about lands. On Monday night Daisy and Samuel Wogbara came over from Goulburn Is. and they talked to the meeting. They said that the best thing to do would be for all the tribes to come together and take all Arnhem Land for all ungagulia people They didn't think it was a good idea to cut all the country up into small pieces. If one tribe found minerals on their land it could be shared with all the people of Arnhem Land. There shouldn't be some rach people and some poor people, Daisy said that people should hurry up. If this Government goes away the chance will be lost forever.

Maningrida people decided that they needed more time to think about these things. It was easy for Goulburn people but Maningrida had many tribes to worry about.

On Tuesday all Maningrida men had a long meeting and there were many different ideas. Some people were speaking for everyone coming together and others were speaking for staying tribe to tribe. Some people still did not understand what the new Government's thinking was.

On Wednesday many reople spoke-- Ibberara, Munyal, Fordham, Baleiya and Mulumbuk. Silas Roberts made a very good speech explaining in 'pidgin' English what the Government was doing. Silas thought that coming together was a good idea. Silas talked about the old days. Then people own theit own land but they didn't block each other. Sometimes they had spear business but they fixed it up. It could be the same now. If all the black people came together they would have a loud voice for the Government to listen. This wouldn't stop people from their own business or stop people living in a quie place like Kopanga if they wanted to. Many other people spoke for forming all tribes together. The President asked for a vote and a big votewent for joining together. The President is going to send a telegram to Goulburn to say that Maningrida. Is ready to join in bringing all the tribes of Arnhem Land together to speak. Land together to speak,
