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COLLECTION OVERVIEW

Scope and content note

The collection consists of unpublished papers, nearly all written by Neil McGarvie.

The papers relate to Queensland Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander education. Included is a historical outline of Indigenous education from 1965 to 1985 and of Presbyterian Missions in North Queensland, information on teacher preparation, a report on policy aspects of assimilation in secondary schools and material on teaching manual arts.

Neil McGarvie donated the collection to the Institute in May 2000.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

After leaving Victoria in the mid 1960s Neil J. McGarvie became a manual arts teacher, and later an advisory teacher, for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander manual arts, with the Queensland Department of Education from, 1978 until about 1985. He was appointed the first Principal Education Officer of the Aboriginal and Islander Education Branch of the Queensland Department of Education in the late 1980s.

The consultation was part of a review that resulted in the decision to establish Secondary Departments in Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander

- Communities. An extensive building program was subsequently initiated. The alternative was for students to continue to attend boarding school at places such as Charters Towers.
