These recordings were made by Martha Ansara between 1992 and 1993 and were used in the video program *My life as I live it* about prominent Muruwari woman Essie (Essieina) Coffey, OAM. They feature oral history accounts by Essie Coffey and Feli McHughes and music performed by Smiley and the Codrockers. One of the tapes features a recording of Arthur Dodd made for the Brewarrina Aboriginal Cultural Museum. The collection was deposited at AIATSIS by Essie Coffey on 22 October 1993.

6	ANSARA_M02- 012406	Several takes of 'Smalley my bottle' performed by Smiley and the Codrockers (guitars and voice); ends with explanation of the story by Essie Coffey
7	ANSARA_M02- 012407	Essie Coffey introduces the song 'Smalley my bottle' and casual conversation
8	ANSARA_M02- 012408	Smiley and the Codrockers rehearsal (full band: guitars, bass, keyboard, drums, voice), including 'Midnight Special' and other popular songs
9	ANSARA_M02- 012409	Performance by Smiley and the Codrockers (full band: guitars, bass, keyboard, drums, voice) followed by solo guitar music
