## **Production history**

These recordings were collected on the 29 August 2006 and 30 October 2008 by Salome Harris on behalf of the Diwurruwurru-jaru Aboriginal Corporation. They feature conversations in Mayali and oral history interviews in Mayali, Kriol, Dalabon, Rembarrnga and Kune (or possibly Gundjeihmi). Six of the oral history files are audio components of a video documentary by Tom E. Lewis about renowned *mago* (didjeridu) player and maker, David Blanasi. Speakers include Queenie Brennan, Marie Brennan, Chris Kelly, Glen Wesan, Salome Harris, Tom Kelly, Tom E. Lewis, Frankie (Tango) Lane, Jimmy Wesan, Princess Blanasi, Nelly Weston, Kathleen Lane and Victor Hood.
