## **Production history**

These recordings were collected by Thomas Edward Dutton between 23 August 1978 and 6 September 1978 in Nambour, Ayr, Ingham, Deeral, and Pialba, Queensland in the course of conducting research for the Research School of Pacific Studies, ANU. The collection contains oral histories about blackbirding/kidnapping/forced labour; language evolution, genealogies, race relations and church movements amongst South Sea Island Australians in Queensland. Interviewees include Ernie Byquar, Norah Byquar, Rhoda Lammon, Olly Darr, Charlie Tallin, Esther Henaway, Jack Ambrom, Brian Lynn, Peter Santo (Malaita) Jnr, George Siy Mow and Mary Byquar. The collection was deposited with AIATSIS on 16 October 1978.

ARCHIVIST'S NOTE The aim of the study was to collect remnant language of South Sea Pidgin English, also known as Kanaka Pidgin English, Melanesian Pidgin English or Kanaka creole. The term 'Kanak(a)' was not used here as throughout the recordings the interviewees referred to themselves as 'South Sea'. 'Kanak(a)' was originally a derogatory term used specifically to refer to the indigenous population of New Caledonia. Jack's surname is spelt 'Ambrom', however, the island in Vanuatu he is named after is called Ambrym and there are more 'Ambryms' than 'Ambroms' in the AIATSIS ABI. This finding aid was compiled from information provided by Tom Edward Dutton and audition sheets prepared by AIATSIS staff. Timing points may be slightly out depending on the technologies and procedures in place at the time the recordings were auditioned.
