## SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

**Date:** 1962 - 1968

**Extent:** 8 sound tape reels (ca. 30 min. each) : analogue, 7 1/2 ips, mono; 5 in. + field tape report sheets.

#### **Production history**

The majority of these recordings were collected by John Gordon between 15 May and 1 August, 1968 at Yamba, Lismore, Cabbage Tree Island and Woodenbong, NSW, as part of an AIAS grant to record and transcribe Aboriginal music. The final recordings on Field Tape 9 are copies of interviews with Jim Morgan by Glen Hall and Barbara Gibbons. They were made during May and June 1962 in Lismore, and December 1966 in Bellwood, NSW. The collection, in its entirety, documents songs, stories, oral history and discussions by various people in NSW, including Alexander Cameron, Mrs W F Oakes, Harry Cook, Pastor Frank Roberts Senior, Richard Donnelly, Cecil Taylor, Alex Vesper and Jim Morgan.
