Production history

The recordings in this collection were made during field trips by Dr Luise Hercus (as part of a linguistic study project) to Point Pearce SA, Swan Hill VIC, East Gippsland VIC, Wreck Bay ACT/NSW, Port Kembla NSW, Dareton NSW, Wilcannia NSW, Mena Murtee NSW and Broken Hill NSW during 1963, 1967 and 1968. One of the purposes in collecting these recordings was to salvage dying languages from areas of NSW, Victoria and South Australia.

The field tapes include information on the languages, narratives, songs and customs of the Wergaia, Ngarigo, Kurnai, Yandruwantha, Bundhamara, Kalkatungu, Wadigali, Arabana, Arrernte, Adnyamathanha, Wangaaybuwan and Madhi Madhi peoples. The speakers and performers include Jack Long, Mrs Eleanor Stewart, Mrs Dolly Woodworth, Nola (Eileen) Solomon, Reg McLeod, Alice and Reg Kearns, Alec Booth, Arthur Reid, Ernie King, Barney Coffin and George Dutton.
