#### **Production history**

These recordings were collected in November 1965 by Stephen Wild, an AIAS grantee, during field work at Laverton in Western Australia. The purpose of the trip was to research sacred song cycles of the people of the Western Desert. The interviewees and performers who contributed include Merv Hamilton, Red Kippie, Whittaker Cameron, Charlie Jennings, John Greenwood, Paul Sims, many unidentified female speaker/performers, and children from Laverton Primary School. Dr. Wild was assisted by Dr. Elizabeth May.
