#### **Production history**

These recordings were collected between November 1976 and February 1977 by Mrs Lyndon Rose during fieldwork at Mogo, on the Far South Coast of NSW. The purpose of the field trips was to research the community of Mogo and its development. The collection contains discussions on personal experiences, the fishing industry, occupations, education, community development and early life in Mogo area. Interviewees include Tommy Butler, Andrew Nye, Paul Davies, Madeline Russell, Mrs Smith, Mrs Carriage, Lewis Brown, Sharon Smith, Alan Ruskin, Peter Coleman, Leonard Nye, Mrs Nye, Symalene Nye, Keith Nye, Linda Nye, Mrs Ruth Walker, Mrs Lillian Nye, Erica and Betty Brown.

The collection was deposited at the Australian Institute of Aboriginal Studies on 1 December 1977.
