VU is the official Prompt Education Partner of Malthouse Theatre, allowing opportunities for industry placements, workshops, participation in the Malthouse Provocateurs program, collaborative projects and performance tickets to give you the real-world context for your studies.

OFFSET JOURNAL

Third-year bachelor degree students have the opportunity to develop their skills by collaboratively publishing *Offset*, a journal containing contributions from established and emerging artists.

DESIGN STUDIO

Design Studio offers a simulated work environment for final-year creative arts students to produce commercial work, finished to industry standards and deadlines, for both University and external clients.

PSYCHOLOGY CLINIC

Our Psychology Clinic at VU at MetroWest provides Master of Clinical Psychology students the opportunity to turn their theoretical knowledge into practice, while offering psychological services to the wider community.

SOCIAL WORK CLINICAL PLACEMENTS

Social work students have the opportunity to extend their knowledge and experience by linking theory with the realities of practice through supervised education in at least two professional placements.

PROFESSIONAL PLACEMENT PROGRAM

Students in community development, marketing communications, professional and creative writing and screen media degrees undertake a professional placement under the supervision of a qualified specialist in their area of study, enabling them to graduate with firm skills and an established network in their field.

PARLIAMENTARY INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

Each year, students undertaking a Political Science specialisation have the opportunity to apply for a competitive internship with a member of the Parliament of Victoria during their third year of study. It provides students with real-world experience in public policy research and writing, as well as first-hand exposure to the operation of the parliamentary system.

STUDENT-LED COMMUNICATION AGENCY

Our Student-led Communication Agency is an exciting initiative, as it supports Bachelor of Marketing Communication students to be early career professionals by working with industry clients on real projects to real deadlines.

KINDRED STUDIOS

All music and sound production students have the opportunity to study at Kindred Studios, a professional arts industry facility located 1km from our Footscray Nicholson Campus. VU has its own dedicated music rehearsal, performance and recording spaces as well as a huge range of equipment available for student use.

TV AND RADIO STUDIO

Our media production precinct at our Footscray Park Campus includes a multi-camera television studio that houses a green screen for visual effects and CGI work, a radio studio, post production labs, a Green Room, hair, makeup and costume facilities, and an equipment loans office. Students use HD cameras and professional audio recording equipment and have access to industry standard post-production software tools.



Our arts students have access to a range of industry-standard facilities including specialist computer laboratories at Footscray Park and St Albans Campuses, as well as the emerging 'creative industries hub' at Footscray Nicholson Campus.

CREATIVE ARTS FACILITIES

Our TAFE and higher education programs in creative industries offer state-of-the-art creative learning spaces and professionally-operated facilities. This gives you a unique opportunity to engage with the broader media, and creative arts communities and industries.

DESIGN STUDIO

This commercial e-Design studio offers final-year graphic design students experience producing commercial work for internal and external clients.

THE CENTRE SPACE

The Centre Space is a white-walled open plan public area that is used as a gallery, exhibition, seminar, display or workshop space. It is located at VU's newest facility – VU at MetroWest.

KINDRED STUDIOS

This professional studio offers all music and sound production students the opportunity to study at a professional facility located just 1 km from our Footscray Nicholson Campus.

PSYCHOLOGY CLINIC

Situated at VU at MetroWest, this clinic operates as part of the professional training for Master of Clinical Psychology students. Under the supervision of experienced clinical psychologists, students offer psychological assessment and treatment services to the local community.

GENERAL FACILITIES FOOD AND CAFÉS

Our city campuses have easy access to cafés and food outlets. All other campuses have on-campus cafés and food outlets for students, staff and the wider community.

CLASSROOMS OF THE FUTURE

VU's classrooms are being transformed into creative and technology-rich environments.

The multi-platform learning space at Footscray Nicholson Campus — known as the Terrain Room — is one of a growing number of the University's rejuvenated physical spaces that have transformed classrooms, libraries and lecture theatres into creative learning and teaching environments.

LIBRARIES

Our campus libraries are known as 'learning commons' integrated hubs that offer career advice, learning and IT support, and academic resources, all in a relaxed, lounge-like setting. Our learning commons provide access to photocopying, computing and printing facilities, electronic and print resources, and a comprehensive information skills training program.

HOW MUCH WILL MY COURSE COST?

COURSE FEES AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Course costs vary between VE/TAFE and higher education courses, depending on whether you are a government-funded student or full-fee paying student, and the units you select.

Below you will find some important information and a general guide to costs.* The latest information and a specific guide to study costs, including VU's Unit Fee Schedule, is available at:

VE/TAFE FEES

The fees you pay as a VE/TAFE student depend on a number of factors, including:

- whether the course is government-funded
- your citizenship status
- when you commence the course
- your age
- your prior qualifications
- the units and course that you enrol in.

Some VE/TAFE students may be eligible for a government subsidy (such as the Victorian Training Guarantee) to support tuition fees, depending on:

- citizenship status
- age at time of enrolment
- prior study completed.

VE/TAFE students are also required to pay an annual Student Services and Amenities Fee. In 2016 this amounted to \$204 for full-time government funded students, \$102 for part-time government-funded students, \$42 for students studying off campus and \$84 for concession card holders. Students studying less than 25 hours are exempt from the fee.

VET FEE-HELP is available to assist eligible students studying higher level vocational education and training (VET) qualifications to pay their tuition fees. Higher-level VET qualifications are at the diploma level and above. VET FEE-HELP can be used to pay all or part of an eligible student's tuition fees, but cannot be used for additional study costs such as accommodation or text books.

HIGHER EDUCATION FEES

The options available to students enrolled in higher education courses are:

- Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP) course fees are shared between students and the Australian Government, which subsidises your course fees.
- Full-Fee Place (FFP) you must pay the full cost of your course.

All domestic undergraduate students at Victoria University are enrolled in a Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP).

This table (below) shows the maximum student contribution and full-fee amount for 2016 admissions, per year of full-time study.

Higher education students are also required to pay an annual Student Services and Amenities Fee. In 2016 this amounted to \$290 for full-time students and \$145 for part-time students.

POSTGRADUATE COURSEWORK DEGREE FEES

The University does not receive any government funding for postgraduate coursework student places, and students pay the full cost of their course. This is called a fee-paying place. Tuition fees are based on the units studied, rather than a fixed price for each course. Different units have different costs.

POSTGRADUATE RESEARCH DEGREE FEES

If you qualify for an Australian government-funded place under the Research Training Scheme you will not be required to pay course fees.

If you are offered a full-fee paying place you can apply for FEE-HELP government assistance as outlined below.

PAYING YOUR FEES

There are several options available to help you with the costs involved in studying at university.

HECS-HELP

The Australian Government's Higher Education Loan Program, HECS-HELP, allows Australian citizens and Humanitarian Visa holders to borrow the amount of their student contribution and pay it back once in the workforce and earning a specified amount. You also have the option of paying some or all of your student contribution up-front and receiving a discount.

FEE-HELP

FEE-HELP is a government loan program that enables eligible students to defer the payment of their tuition fees.

FINANCIAL ADVICE

We offer free financial advice and information on all study-related costs. This includes information about government assistance (such as HECS-HELP, Centrelink Youth Allowance and Austudy), household expenses, financial planning, student loans and tax.

UNDERGRADUATE AND TAFE

Applications for undergraduate and vocational education (VE/TAFE) courses are either made through the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC), or by direct application to the University.
