Guam koo-e! war warang all willah. Come on! we will look out 'possum.

Mankatah willah. There is a 'possum.

Willah ! mankatah willah. 'Possum ! there is a 'possum.

Bird-o-men willah. I caught an opossum.

Guam! parry ang all kooray. Come on! we will look out kangaroo.

Man-ak buledya kooyun. You bring him two fellows' spear.

Mambangall ngar kin koorra migo mindeah. If we see any kangaroos in the bend [of the creek] we will catch them.

Men are never named after stones, trees, &c.; but when dead their names are not again heard.
