2015, Hannes Holm, Sweden  
4, 19, 23 May | 2 JuneOve is a grumpy recluse whose life revolves around enforcing neighbourhood rules and visiting his wife's grave until an unlikely friendship blossoms with his new neighbours. *Swedish with English subtitles.*

### Alone in Berlin (M) 103m

1940, Berlin. Upon hearing that their only son has been killed in battle, Otto and Anna find a way to resist Hitler's Nazi party in this chilling historical thriller. Based on the bestselling novel by Hans Fallada.



### BabaKiueria (PG) 30m

In this 1986 short mockumentary, a group of Aboriginal people arrive at a public barbecue area and plant a flag, causing great consternation among picnicking Australians of European descent.

Set in France in the 1880s, Felicie is an orphan with a passion for dance. But can she cut it at the Paris Opera Ballet? A delightful anime about following your dreams and the value of friendship.



### The Baulkham Hills African Ladies Troupe (M) 85m

2016, Ros Horin, Australia  
19, 22 April

A spirited, inspiring documentary about four African women who have fled violence and abuse in their home countries, and the theatre group that allows them to speak out and begin their journey towards healing.



### Elle (MA15+) 130m

2016, Paul Verhoeven, France  
28 April | 22 MayIn this Oscar-nominated psychological thriller, Michele (Isabelle Huppert) is violently assaulted during a home invasion. Choosing not to report the attack, she instead plots revenge and becomes involved in a complex game of cat and mouse. *French with English subtitles.*

### Embrace (M) 90m

### The Coming War on China (exempt) 113m

From journalist and documentarian John Pilger, this film argues that the current tensions between the two biggest economies in the world, USA and China, pose a very real threat of war.



### The Fencer (PG) 99m

2015, Klaus Härö, Finland  
8, 12 May | 1 JuneIn fleeing Russian secret police, Endel finds himself teaching fencing to schoolchildren in Soviet-occupied Finland. Endel's newfound raison d'être is compromised when the children want to attend a competition in Leningrad. *Estonian and Russian with English subtitles.*

Jim Jarmusch takes on iconic punk rocker Iggy Pop in this must-see music doco, exploring the cultural, musical and historical context and legacy of one of the most influential bands in the world.



### I, Daniel Blake (MA15+) 100m

1, 13, 20 May

Daniel Blake is a 59-year-old carpenter forced onto welfare benefits after a health scare. He becomes an accidental hero when he finds himself caught in the barbed wire of welfare bureaucracy as played out against the rhetoric of 'striver and skiver' in modern-day Britain.

26 May

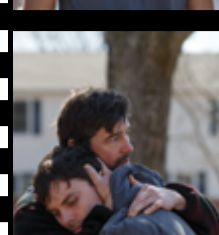
One of the most iconic rock and roll singers of all time, Janis Joplin, is honoured in this documentary, with revelatory interviews with her family and the musicians she worked with.



### Lion (PG) 118m

2016, Garth Davis, Australia  
21, 26, 29 April | 16 May

Based on an incredible true story. Six-year-old street kid Saroo (Dev Patel) is adopted as a small child by an Australian couple (Nicole Kidman and David Wenham). As a young man he is compelled to find his birth family in India.



### Manchester by the Sea (MA15+) 137m

17, 25 May

When Patrick's father dies, his uncle Lee (Casey Affleck, in an Oscar-winning performance) is assigned as his legal guardian. Returning to his hometown, Lee must confront his past and figure out how to care for his teenage nephew.



### Nocturnal Animals (MA15+) 116m

A neo-noir psychological thriller with two, skillfully interwoven, simultaneous plots. Susan (Amy Adams) receives a dark and unsettling novel in the mail, dedicated to her and written by her jilted ex-husband (Jake Gyllenhaal).

In classic off-beat Jim Jarmusch style, Paterson (Adam Driver), is your average everyman, a bus driver and poet who finds beauty and humour in the ordinariness of daily life.

21, 29 April | 19 May

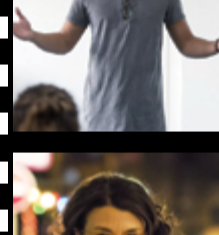
