Originally published by Mosher. 100 illustrations. Morris, Pre-Raphaelites, Aesthetes, 1890s poets—an important anthology. Very good in blue cloth boards, paper labels to spines. Minor browning to spines and minor wear/rubbing to boards. Clean interiors, occasional smudge marks and minor chipping of some pages. (24050) \$125.00
