International support for the Palestinians is growing as they continue to stand up to their oppressors. The campaign for boycott, divestment and sanctions is increasingly effective.

The Israeli response is increased repression at home and a stepped-up effort to improve its image abroad.

The latest phase of Israel's propaganda war in Britain is to label all its critics 'antisemitic'. The immediate target is Jeremy Corbyn's leadership of the Labour Party, but the longer-term aim is to make people reluctant even to talk about Palestine for fear of being accused of racism.

Is it racist to call for an end to the siege of Gaza or to decry the system of apartheid on the West Bank? How do Palestinian citizens of Israel survive in a state that claims to be defined by race and religion?

Liverpool Friends of Palestine welcome two important speakers to share their views and stimulate discussion:

Salma Karmi-Ayyoub is a criminal barrister and a consultant for the Palestinian human rights organisation Al Haq. She is co-chair of Lawyers for Palestinian Human Rights.

Tony Greenstein is a member (currently suspended) of Brighton Labour Party and secretary of Brighton and Hove Unemployed Workers Centre. He is a founder member of the Palestine Solidarity Campaign.
